- Role of digitisation in ensuring cultural diversity

- Increasing digitization gives rise to a number of social, economic, cultural and legal transformations, forcing film and audiovisual heritage institutions and archives to reinvent themselves
- The digital environment has no territorial boundaries and offers opportunities to increase cultural exchanges, to develop creativity and to broaden access to the diversity of cultures and languages of the European Union



- Intensify efforts to digitize film and audiovisual material and increase its accessibility through Europeana and in line with principles of Digital Agenda
- More and better cooperation on sectoral and cross-sectoral level on local, regional, national or European level





AUDIOVISUAL ARCHIVES IN THE 21ST CENTURY VOORUIT - GHENT CONCLUSIONS

 Examine how to ensure sufficient legal certainty in respect of intellectual property rights for film and audiovisual heritage institutions, in order to facilitate the accomplishment of their public interest missions and to support mass digitisation, mass clearance, educational use and innovation





AUDIOVISUAL ARCHIVES IN THE 21ST CENTURY VOORUIT - GHENT CONCLUSIONS

- Framework for public private partnerships should be further developed
- Innovation and more effective use of new technologies offer important benefits for education
- Promote European standards on interoperability of film and audiovisual databases
- Intensify research on how to prepare for the semantic web
