10:02:41	<p>SOUNDBITE by Cecilia Malmström (in ENGLISH) saying that the report is a very valuable tool, not only for the Commission but for stakeholders and national authorities all over Europe in order to get scientific based information on the drug situation in Europe; the report shows that some of the traditional drugs – cannabis, heroin, cocaine – seem to be decreasing slightly, which is very positive; on the other hand, it shows that new substances appear with an alarming rate: more than one a week is reported to the centre - 57 so far in 2012; but through the early warning mechanism, through the scientific work done at the EMCDDA, the evaluation and the risk-assessment can be done and spread in the Member States, so that they can work together in order to address this phenomenon.</p>	00:00:49
