## Special meeting of the European Council: all arrivals (day)

The Heads of State or Government of the European Union gathered today in Brussels for a two-day special meeting of the European Council on the Multiannual Financial Framework (MFF) 2014 - 2020. Negotiations on the new budget were expected to be very tough, against the backdrop of economic crisis, and high tensions between the Member States who want to reduce EU spending and the others in favour of the European Commission's proposal. Eleven EU Leaders so far have threatened to veto the EU budget unless they get a better deal. Ahead of the European Council, Herman Van Rompuy, President of the



European Council, and José Manuel Barroso, President of the EC, held bilateral meetings all day long with several Member States to try to find an agreement.
