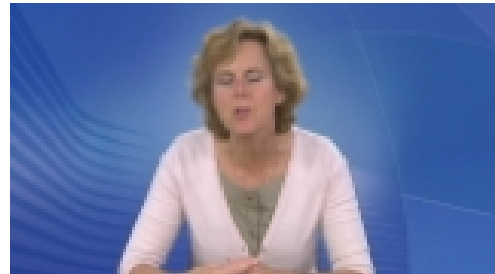


**Message by Connie Hedegaard on US President Barack Obama's declaration on climate action plan**

On 26 June 2013, Connie Hedegaard, Member of the EC in charge of Climate Action, made a declaration where she welcomed the announcement of Barack Obama, President of the United States, on the intention to map out America's first climate change strategy, cutting greenhouse gas emissions from power plants, shoring up coastlines against flooding and sea level rise, and helping advance an international climate deal.

That is why the Commission has presented a green paper so that we can now move on to define our 2030 target because it does without saying we can only make the global transition into a more low carbon world that we really need if all of us do more.
