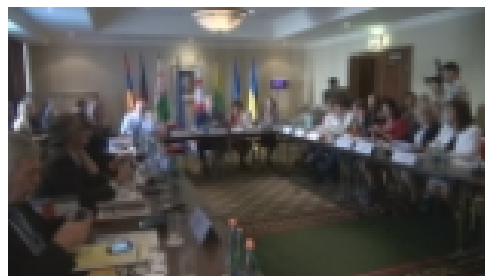


## Participation of Androulla Vassiliou to the 3rd Informal Eastern Partnership Dialogue Meeting, in Yerevan

Androulla Vassiliou, Member of the EC in charge of Education, Culture, Multilingualism and Youth, participated in the Education Ministers' session of the third informal Eastern Partnership Dialogue meeting in Yerevan, Armenia, on 13 September 2013. In her speech, Androulla Vassiliou highlighted the new opportunities which will be created by Erasmus+, the EU's new programme for education, training, youth and sport, for students from Eastern Partnership countries who aim to spend part of their degree studies at EU universities.
