Professor Philip McCann holds *The University of Groningen Endowed Chair of Economic Geography*. He is one of the world's most highly cited and widely recognised economic geographers and spatial economists of his generation, having published over one hundred academic research papers. Philip McCann is also part-time affiliated *Professor of Economics* in the Department of Economics at The University of Waikato, New Zealand, and formerly *Professor of Urban and Regional Economics* in the Department of Economics, at The University of Reading, UK.

Invited as a keynote speaker in over seventy national and international conferences, seminars and symposia in nineteen countries

2010 Awarded the *ERSA 50th Anniversary Award* for outstanding research at the European Regional Science Association Congress, Jönköping, Sweden. The European Regional Science Association, an academic body of 3500 members, celebrates its fiftieth year in 2010, and the special award was to commemorate this milestone.

2008 *Academician* of the United Kingdom *Academy of Social Sciences*

Awarded the *2002 Hewings Award* for outstanding scholarship by the North American Regional Science Association, an academic body of over one thousand members. The first non North American-based scholar to win this prestigious award.

Awarded the *2006 Moss Madden Memorial Medal* by the British & Irish Regional Science Association in 2007 for the most outstanding published paper in a regional science topic in 2006 (jointly awarded with Alessandra Faggian).

Co-Editor of *Papers in Regional Science*, Co-Editor of *Spatial Economic Analysis*, Co-Editor of *Review of Urban and Regional Development Studies*, and Editor of the Edward Elgar Book Series *New Horizons in Regional Science*.

Author of *Urban and Regional Economics*, 2001, Oxford University Press, which is currently being used in over twenty countries, and is globally the best selling book in the field. The book has been translated into Greek, Korean, Japanese and Chinese. In addition, two of Philip McCann's other books have also been translated into Japanese.

Educated at The University of Cambridge, Professor McCann has previously taught at University of Cambridge, University of Pennsylvania, and University of Reading, and has also previously held Visiting Professorships in USA, Japan, and Thailand.
