



Tamás F. FREUND (HG)

Tamás F. Freund is a Professor and Director of the Institute of Experimental Medicine, Hungarian Academy of Sciences, Budapest, and Chairman of the Neuroscience Department of the Péter Pázmány Catholic University in Budapest. He has been president of the Federation of European Neuroscience Societies (FENS) from 2004 till 2006, and served as member of the Executive Committee of IBRO between 1998-2003, and as Chairman of the IBRO Central and Eastern Europe Regional Committee (1999-2003). He is a member of the Hungarian Academy of Sciences (1998), the Academia Europaea (London, 2000), the German Academy of Sciences Leopoldina (2001), the Academia Scientiarum et Artium Europaea (2001), and the recipient of numerous prizes and awards of which The Brain Prize (2011, Denmark) is considered the most prestigious. His main scientific interest is the synaptic and molecular organization, functional architecture and physiology of neuronal circuits in the cerebral cortex and related structures, the network basis of behaviour-dependent neuronal activity patterns, the changes in neuronal connectivity/chemical architecture underlying epileptic and ischemic brain damage, the mechanisms of anxiety and endocannabinoid signaling in relation to addiction.
