1. On 25.05.2007, the Commission received notification of a proposed concentration pursuant to Article 4 of Council Regulation (EC) No. 139/2004 by which the undertakings Deutsche Bank AG ("Deutsche Bank", Germany) and American International Group Inc. ("AIG", USA) acquire within the meaning of Article 3(1)(b) of the Council Regulation joint control over logistics properties and land in Moscow commonly known as Pushkino Logistics Park 1 ("PLP 1"), Pushkino Logistics Park 2 ("PLP 2") and Domodedovo Logistics Park ("DLP") by way of purchase of shares in a newly created entity, constituting a joint venture.
2. The business activities of the undertakings concerned are:

- for undertaking Deutsche Bank corporation active in deposit and lending operations, issuing business, asset management, investment banking and financial services;
  - for undertaking AIG: a company providing insurance and financial services;
  - for undertaking PLP1, PLP2, DLP: logistics properties and land located in Moscow.
3. After examination of the notification, the Commission has concluded that the notified operation falls within the scope of Council Regulation (EC) No. 139/2004 and of paragraph 5, subparagraph a of the Commission Notice on a simplified procedure for treatment of certain concentrations under Council Regulation (EC) No. 139/2004<sup>2</sup>.
  4. For the reasons set out in the Notice on a simplified procedure, the Commission has decided not to oppose the notified operation and to declare it compatible with the common market and with the EEA Agreement. This decision is adopted in application of Article 6(1)(b) of Council Regulation (EC) No. 139/2004.
