Dr Anneli Pauli is Deputy Director General of the DG Joint Research Centre (JRC) of the European Commission since April 2007.

She gained her PhD in 1994 from the University of Helsinki. Her field of research is aquatic microbiological ecology.

Dr Pauli has been Vice President of the Academy of Finland 2001-2007, responsible for matters concerning science policy and research funding as well as international cooperation. Before that she worked as Secretary General of the Research Council for Environment and Natural Resources of the Academy of Finland, having also responsibility for the implementation and development of the Finnish Centre of Excellence Programmes. In addition she has worked for the Finnish Ministry of the Environment, Water and Environment Research Institute, Marine Research Institute, University of Helsinki and Helsinki University of Technology, as well as in the private sector.

Dr Pauli has been member of the European Strategy Forum on Research Infrastructures (ESFRI), and was actively involved in various ERA-NET projects, chairing, for example, the Network Steering Committee of 'BONUS for the Baltic Sea Science – Network of Funding Agencies'. She has also been a member of the OECD Global Science Forum and held memberships of several Nordic and European committees. She was Vice-Chair of the Nordic Research Board (NordForsk) and member of the Steering Committee of the Nordic Centre of Excellence Pilot Programme, and earlier was member of the Nordic Research Policy Council (Nordic Council of Ministers). In addition, Dr Pauli has worked in numerous national committees dealing with science and technology policy.
