



Kerstin ELIASSON

Kerstin Eliasson, MA in Sociology from American University, Washington DC (USA) (1973), BA in Social and Political Science and French from Stockholm University (1965).

Since 2007 Kerstin Eliasson is a member of the Strategic Forum on International S&T Cooperation (SFIC), a senior advisor on international cooperation for Uppsala University, a Member of the Board of the Music College in Stockholm and involved in international cooperation in research infrastructure.

From 1 February 2004 to 10 October 2006, Kerstin Eliasson held the position of State Secretary at Sweden's Ministry of Education, Science and Culture. Prior to this (October 2000-February 2004), she was Science Counsellor at the Office of Science and Technology, Swedish Embassy, Washington, DC (USA).

As Director for Research Policy at Sweden's Ministry of Education and Science, from 1993 to September 2000, Ms. Eliasson was responsible for research councils, the Royal Library, coordination of the Government's research policy, coordination of EU-research, research bills, and the Government's Advisory Board for Research.

Prior to this appointment, Kerstin Eliasson was Advisor to the Prime Minister's Office, reporting on U.S. science policies (1988-1993). From 1976 to 1993, she was Head of Section of various directorates of the Ministry of Education and Science, mainly dealing with research policy and international issues. Ms. Eliasson's previous positions were that of Secretary to the Commission on Education and Training (1975-1976) and Project Director at the Swedish Institute for Opinion Research (1974-1975).

From 2000 to 2004, Kerstin Eliasson was Chair of the auditors of the Nobel Foundation. From 1987 to 1991, she was Chair of the OECD Committee for Scientific and Technological Policy and OECD examiner of science and technology policies of Switzerland and Italy. She is a former member of the Research Grants Committee, Swedish Institute and of the Scandinavian Institute for African Studies.
