



## **Dr. Walter Mönig**

Walter Mönig, born February 1948 in Wuppertal, Germany. Diplom-Volkswirt (1966-1971) and Dr. rer. pol (1975) in Economics from the University of Cologne.

He is currently Director for European Affairs and Deputy Director General for European and International Cooperation at the Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF).

His return to the BMBF followed an appointment with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs as Science Counsellor at the Permanent Representation of Germany to the EU in Brussels from 2001 to 2005.

During the period 1978-2001, he held a variety of positions at the BMBF working on Planning, Research Policy, Systems Analysis; International Cooperation (in charge of the German Membership in CERN, EMBL, ESO; delegate on the Board of these organizations, in charge of other multilateral organizations, including ESRF, ETW, IEA, NEA, Urenco); Press Office (Head of Unit); Research Policy of the European Union (Head of Unit); Staff policy (Head of Unit); Co-operation with Western European Countries; Mediterranean; Africa; EUREKA (Head of Unit).

Prior to joining the BMBF, Dr. Mönig was Research Associate and Assistant Professor (1975/1976) at the Institute for Energy Economics of the University of Cologne from 1971 to 1976 and, in 1977, economist in the Planning Division of VIAG (Vereinigte Industrie Unternehmungen AG), Bonn.
