



**SUMMARY OFFERS OF ASSISTANCE  
HAITI (HT) - EARTHQUAKE  
(Status 25 January 2010, 11:00 UTC)**

- 7 Water sanitation units: EU, BE, DE, FR, ES (2), SE and water purification tablets: IT, DE, PT
- 5 Assessment teams (23 pax): IT, DE, UK, IRE, ES
- 1,161 tents: AT (400), SE (200), IT (155), SI (25), SK (15), ES (55), PT (44), BG (67), PL (200)
- 1 TAST/Base-camp with a capacity 200 people: this is a joint-module of SE, DK, NO, EE and FI.
- EU co-financing for transport of assistance requested or approved so far reaches a total amount of EUR 3 million.
- EU CP Assessment and Coordination Team on site since 14.01.2010. A second team has arrived in Port-au-Prince on 23.01, to replace the existing team.
