Is FLINKMAN necessary?

The Need

Flood risks should be managed more effectively by adopting an holistic, joined-up, and integrated approach, in order to minimize human and capital losses.

Many and different Stakeholders should be involved.

The Problem(s)?

- Which stakeholders should be involved in a Flood Management Plan and to which extent?
- Which must be the roles and responsibilities of involved stakeholders?
- Which should be the engagement framework that will improve their efficiency and effectiveness and will avoid disputes?

FLINKMAN Objective

The development of the appropriate simplified framework promoting the efficient stakeholders engagement through the preparation and implementation phase of a flood management plan in order to ensure their consistent and effective linking into each stage of the flood prevention-preparedness-response-remediation chain

FLINKMAN intends to:

- inform, sensitize and motivate all potential stakeholders to actively participate on flood management plans (planning and implementation)
- propose new approaches that will allow different organizations to work together and develop a shared understanding of the most suitable solutions to water flooding
- upgrade the existing civil protection modules taking into account the specified needs and initiating the proper participatory mechanisms
- enhance the transnational cooperation with competent bodies all over Europe

FLINKMAN Follow-up & Capitalisation Actions

Flinkman partners will institute a European Cluster Unit (ECU) that will be hosted by Region of Central Macedonia, Hellas that will be responsible for the provision of future coordination and technical support actions after the project conclusion.

FLINKMAN ECU aims to:

- i)the coordination on items like know how and experience exchange, research and technology transfer, common resources usage etc.
- ii)the expansion of the cooperation in other geographical areas facing flood disasters risks, too
- iii)the entering into new joined collaborations and projects on Flood management aspects for capitalization project's results.

FLINKMAN website will remain active and will be continuously updated at least 5 years after the end of the project (ECU responsibility)

Expected results

- Creation of an IT tool and establishment of broad European partnership in order to acquire and record, manage and disseminate easily and effectively valuable information regarding flood prevention and management
- Identification and presentation of effective engagement mechanisms of competent, public and private authorities involved in flood management
- Instigation of stakeholders involved in Flood Management to comprehend their engagement and develop the necessary capacities in technical means and human resources
- Initialization of a closer cooperation of stakeholders involved in Flood Management and other disasters via a participatory process
- Promote the reproduction potential and transferability of the project's outputs to other geographical areas facing similar risks
