
Common Problems: Entry and Operations

Common Problems: Quality and Coordination

- Inappropriate relief items and activities
- Untrained or unqualified personnel
- Lack of respect for domestic authorities and relief actors
- Lack of respect for beneficiaries
- Failure to coordinate



Gaps in existing international instruments



- Lack of geographic reach (few parties to treaties)
- Lack of thematic scope
 - Type of disaster
 - Type of actor
- Lack of awareness
- Lack of use

A few European instruments to highlight

- Council resolution of 8 July 1991
- Council Decision establishing the CP Mechanism (2001 – recast in 2007)
- EUR-OPA Major Hazards Agreement
- Barcelona Convention



Guidelines on the Domestic Facilitation and Regulation of International Disaster Relief and Initial Recovery Assistance

- Recommendations to governments on how to prepare domestic legal frameworks
- Compile existing international norms and best practice on legal facilities
- Ways to ensure both respect for sovereignty and a quick response

EU Joint Pledge on the IDRL Guidelines

- Without prejudice to obligations under the Treaty on European Union:
 - The EU supports the aim pursued by the IFRC in its draft guidelines
 - Member States will examine the possibility of participation in regional pilot projects to disseminate the guidelines



Work already underway



- Norway, Sweden and Denmark have already begun formal analyses of their domestic laws pursuant to their concept of "host nation support"
- Finnish and Swiss officials are also considering these issues
