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## **COMMISSION DECISION**

#### THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION,

Having regard to the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union,

Having regard to Council Re gulation (EC) No 1257/96 of 20 June 1996 concerning humanitarian aid<sup>1</sup>, and in particular Articles 4 and 15(2) thereof,

#### Whereas:

- (1) In order to m aximise the benefits of hum anitarian aid to victim s it is necessary to be able to provide efficient, appropriate and effective technical assistance. This technical assistance is provided by experts recreated under direct contracts with the Commission. This financing decision follows on from previous decisions.
- (2) The Comm ission also needs to respond positively to the concerns of the Council<sup>2</sup>, which asked for an improvement in humanitarian aid response mechanisms through an enhanced capability to dispatch experts into the field and to respond rapidly.
- (3) In order to m aintain and streng then the syst em of individual experts, it is es timated that EUR 20 000 000 under Article 23 02 01 of the 2010 general budget of the European Union is needed to achieve the objectives of this Decision.
- (4) The Commission should im plement the budget f or this technical assistance by direct centralised management in its departments.
- (5) Selection and recruitment procedures are set out in a call for applications published in the Official Journal <sup>3</sup>. The experts recruited will be offered empl oyment contracts by the Directo rate-General for Hum anitarian Aid (ECHO) to carry out the technical assistance work.

- (6) This Decision constitutes a financing decisi on within the meaning of Article 75 of the Financial R egulation (EC, Euratom) No 1605/2002<sup>4</sup>, Article 90 of the detailed rules for the implementation of the Financial Regulation (EC, Euratom) No 2342/2002<sup>5</sup> and Article 15 of the internal rules for the implementation of the general budget of the European Union<sup>6</sup>.
- (7) In accordance with Article 17(3) of Council Regulation (EC) No 1257/96 of 20 June 1996 concerning humanitarian aid, the Humanitarian Aid Committee gave a favourable opinion on 4 March 2010,

## HAS DECIDED AS FOLLOWS:

## Article 1

- 1. The Commission hereby approves total fi nancing of EUR 20 000 000 under Article 23 02 01 of the 2010 general budget of the Eur opean Union to ensure the continued financing of technical assistance and operational support provided by ECHO in thir d countries.
- 2. These experts will be recruited according to the methods and procedures set out in the call for applications published in the Official Journa 1<sup>7</sup> and will be offered employment contracts under Belgian law by DGECHO to carry out the technical assistance work.
- 3. In accordance with Article 4 of Co uncil Regulation (EC) No 1257/96 of 20 June 1996 concerning humanitarian aid, the principal aim of this Decision is to m aximise the benefits of aid to victims and enhance the capacity of the Directorate-General for Humanitarian Aid (ECHO) to determ ine prio rities f or the use of this aid. The is initiative will be implemented with the following specific objective:
  - To provide technical ass istance in the field to enhance the capacity and expertise of DG ECHO in order to maximise the benefits of the humanitarian aid operations supported by the European Commission.

The total amount provided for in this Decision is allocated to this objective.

## Article 2

1. The end of the im plementation period of this Decision is set at 31 December 2014. The employment contracts for implementing this Decision will have a maximum duration of three years and be drawn up before 31 December 2011, in accordance with the applicable rules on global commitments<sup>8</sup>.

2. The inherent costs of the initiatives provided f or by this Decision sh all be e ligible from the date on which this Decision is adopted.

Article 3

The Commi ssion shall im plement this Decision by direct centralised management in its departments.

Article 4

This Decision shall take effect on the date of its adoption.
