

# Information – Security Data

## Context

From 1st July 2009, security data has to be provided **before** arrival or departure of the goods into or out of the Community customs territory.

## What does "security data" exactly mean?

It is the information in other words it is the "data elements" detailed in [Annex 30A](#) of the Customs Code Implementing Provisions as last amended by [Regulation 169/2010](#) of 1 March 2010.

## Transitional period

The transitional period in place between 1 July 2009 and 31 December 2010 for the provision of [Entry Summary Declaration](#) and [Exit Summary Declaration](#), implies that these data elements are requested as of 1 July 2009 only for export declarations.

## Data requirements

The data requirements can be found in Tables 1 to 6 of [Annex 30A](#) as last amended by [Regulation 169/2010](#) of 1 March 2010.

Annex 30A defines the following specific datasets:

- **at entry**, datasets for some modes of transport (air, sea, inland waterways, rail and road) and for AEOs;
- similarly, **at exit**, datasets for air, sea, inland waterways, air and ship supplies and for AEOs;
- Finally, there are specific datasets for postal and express consignments operations at entry at exit.

Attention must be drawn to the fact that from 1 July 2009, the registration numbers attributed nationally will be available at Community level ([EORI](#)). Therefore, all registration numbers of persons that, according to legislation, must be established in the Community will be controlled.

## Simplified procedures
