Description	<p>Small states have a special need to build multilateral security arrangements as they generally cannot rely on their own capabilities for complete defence. The program's objective is to focus on solutions that small states can in theory and have made in practice for their security arrangements. In the European context, these include entering NATO and/or the EU and participating in OSCE and sub-regional arrangements of various kinds. Both external and internal aspects of security will be covered and the applicability of concepts such as functional and societal security will be explored. The target group is BA- and MA-students of international and European Affairs, interested in small states and security. The main activities of the program will involve a two week long academic program where students interact with experts in these fields and develop their own thinking on the subjects. The expected outputs include the development of knowledge on small states and security across European universities and increased and improved collaboration among scholars in this field.</p>
