Description	<p>Objectives of the IP course are: better knowledge on competitiveness, innovation and entrepreneurship processes in nature based tourism services in Europe; overview on best practice cases for innovation and entrepreneurship in nature based tourism services in Europe; built up a practical toolbox for innovation, adapted for areas, sectors and enterprises which usually do not have a leading role in innovation processes; develop students' competences to deal with innovation and entrepreneurship in their own working environment; strength the networking between the partners; develop students' ability to think and work in an international context and to learn from others experience.</p> <p>The direct target group benefiting from the project results will be the Master level students and PhD students and the indirect target group will be the teachers, the universities curricula and the faculties. Also the indirect target group will be the tourism enterprises to transfer the knowledge and innovation. This intensive programme is for undergraduate and postgraduate students of business, tourism, environment, who are interested in new knowledge, international exchange, and, as much as possible, students with professional work experience. The Master and PhD students will be selected after bachelor level, work experience, case studies and ability to communicate. The selection criteria ponder equally the students' background and the students' potential to finally implement in their working environment the practical toolbox studied during the IP.</p> <p>The main activities are divided in three stages: Stage I: Students must prepare an innovative case study from their own country Stage II: 11 days of intensive course in Suceava, Romania: intensive course on special domains, work groups activities, field trips, excursions. Stage III: Each student will finalize his case study report. The final research will be presented to the company that represented his case study.</p> <p>The expected outputs of the project will be (all the material will be in English): tested curriculum of 11 days intensive course; teaching material related to this curriculum, edited and formulated into a uniform package, published in the web pages of the IP; model of e-learning which could be adapted to be used in several different platforms instead of being institute specific; case study reports of the students, individual by each student, accompanied by a presentation; innovation plans of the students; a project website; a practical e-Brochure of the project in English language.</p>

Description	<p>Objectives The project objective is to create an opportunity for study which implied EU teachers and student's team in the field of applied classic and modern methods for molecular diagnostics applied in human pathology. The project purpose teaching and practical activities, in intention to offer UE exchange of different knowledge's concerning different methods used for molecular diagnostics.</p> <p>Target groups Using theoretical knowledge and practical techniques, this Intensive Programme will establish the different methods used for molecular diagnostics applied in human pathology. Teaching activities and practical methods used in this Intensive Programme will be attractive for all participants (master students, PhD students) as primary target group and teachers (indirect beneficiary) interested in establish the molecular diagnostics in human pathology.</p> <p>Main activities The aim of this project is to promote different techniques used in cellular and molecular biology as demand for study and establish molecular diagnostic in human diseases. The level of knowledge of postgraduate students (master and PhD students) will improve in the field of classic and modern methods for molecular diagnostics in human pathology. During the project development, there will be elaborated different types of didactical materials for dissemination the information regarding the classic and modern methods for molecular diagnostics in human pathology. The purpose from the teaching staff is to offer trainees for all international participants of the project. At the end of the Intensive Programme, will be provide 5 ECTS and of the end of course, Diploma Supplement for all participants. All participants implied in this project, will have an important contribution to dissemination the information about methods used for establish the molecular diagnostic in human pathology. The partnership will have an important contribution to use the products and activities, in different ways and means, involving students, and other interested academic or non-academic media.</p> <p>Expected outputs Using the interdisciplinary knowledge transfer, implied techniques in cellular and molecular biology, genetics, molecular basis of development, molecular mechanisms of human diseases, diagnostic and therapeutic potential in molecular medicine, and more others, the project will contribute to promote scientific activity. The methodologies and teaching materials used for molecular diagnostics in human diseases, offer a opportunity to exchange experience during two weeks, for all participants to this project. The European co-operation will make possible the obtaining of different didactical tools (books, CD/DVD with video presentations for practical activities, web site with on-line material for teaching and evaluation) The students and teachers involved in mobilities in the frame of International Summer Course – "Classic and modern methods for molecular diagnostics in human pathology – MDHP" will work in international groups. Description	<p>Objectives of the project</p> <p>The aim of this IP is to contribute to the scientific development and awareness of future social and political scientists, media and communication specialists in the light of the European development process, institutional change, social structuring and global governance inside the process of shaping an interdependent world and a widespread knowledge based society. Specific professional approaches are taking new shapes. The IP will aim to provide support for real cross-cultural competence learning expertise, both for students and as well as for lecturers and researchers interested to get involved in exploratory research regarding emergent scientific trends of the 21st century in Europe. The project focuses on improving and building competences for students and staff members. Keywords are: European integration cooperation and institutional change; globalization and global governance impact in Europe, democratic values, sustainable development; cross-cultural communication; human rights and ethnicity; role of media and communication/PR in a global society; minorities in society; peace journalism; transparency and integrity in civil society; future oriented professional and EU knowledge, skills and attitudes; interactive education approach (competence learning); knowledge management; interactive E-learning; multidisciplinary approach; co-operation between EU and 'new' countries. The aims will structurally be connected with the horizontal, Erasmus and IP priorities. The aims of the project are:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Gaining knowledge of the way in which democratization and global governance are shaping institutional and social change in different European countries. 2. Gaining insight into the way social/cultural/organizational circumstances in Europe influence the professional practice and vice versa in the process of framing a knowledge based society. 3. Gaining cross-cultural skills in dealing with cultural dimensions within the European context and in the larger context of a globalized world. 4. Developing a cross-cultural professional attitude in cooperating and dialogue with project participants from different countries and cultures in Europe. <p>Target group:</p> <p>The direct beneficiaries of the project are: 2nd and 3rd year's students of the participating institutions; teachers and researchers of the participating institutions, experts. The indirect beneficiaries of the IP are partner universities through creation of a research consortium and curricular development through insertion of an emerging and challenging topic in regular programs of study.</p> <p>Main activities</p> <p>Lectures, guest lectures, workshops, professional debate sessions, brainstorming, intercultural sharing and learning, open-floor discussions, portfolio making.</p> <p>Expected outputs:</p> <p>The main output of the project is the setting up of a community of research for emerging issues in European context that address this need by organising learning programmes targeting sustainability issues that are relevant to the adult learners. The main characteristic of these community- is to seek to empower adult learners by</p>

actively involving them in the various stages of the continuous learning process. In this respect, the ideology promoted by the project considers the process as being more important than the product. Actively involving adults in the learning programmes and future joint programmes of study ensures ownership of the idea and a guarantee that the initiative is maintained long after the project is terminated. The other outputs of the project are viewed either as means to help the project achieve its major goal or as means of disseminating the novel pedagogy and experiences of the project to other interested parties. These outputs include:

1. Students and lecturer's position paper describing the criteria that regulate the project's action plans. The paper will be based on a needs survey and a literature review about democratization, transparency and global governance within a European perspective and will set the parameters for future learning and research.
2. A resource file with the action plans (i.e. the educational programmes including course materials if required) of the summer course. The resource file would also have outlines of the formative evaluation strategies that would be adopted during the project.
3. Research journals from each partner universities documenting the development of the various issues included inside the IP.
4. A Democracy, Transparency and Global Governance Edited volume presenting pedagogical guidelines, case studies and examples of good practice obtained from outputs. This project output would be presented in both printed and CD-rom version.
5. A project website will be set up having the following sections:
 - an online downloadable version of the materials produced specially for the IP
 - full texts of all project's outputs
 - information about each individual and program (eg. staff, activities, educational programmes, reports, documents)

Description	<p>The IP in Sustainable development & Conservation is the result of needs analyse and experience of 8 partner universities from 8 countries working together during the last years in the frame of the European Virtual Seminar on Sustainable Development (EVS), coordinated by the Open University of Netherlands (http://studienet.ou.nl/webapps/portal/frameset.jsp). The Polytechnic University of Bucharest is not yet partner in EVS and is aiming to promote the EVS results and prospects further cooperation in education.</p> <p>EVS is a flexible master course that is part of master programmes or undergraduate programme at different universities, running every year since 2001. University of Bucharest joined the network in 2002 and since then more than 50 Romanian students graduated.</p> <p>The IP is connected with the new MSc Programme Applied Geo-Biology for Natural and Cultural Heritage Conservation (AGB-NCHC) developed by partner faculties within University of Bucharest.</p> <p>The IP objectives are: to organise a blended learning intensive programme in Sustainable development based on EVS experience; To develop teaching materials and services for students, postgraduates and teachers in Sustainable development for EVS and MS programme, and To produce services to inform master students, postgraduates and teachers in order to facilitate their involvement in international blended learning programmes.</p> <p>The IP activities are related to a new approach in EVS course development and is establishing a blended learning experience. E-learning infrastructure of EVS and partner universities and educational software (Blackboard software, web page course and internet, Moodle, Elluminate, Doodle, Wiki, Share Point) will be combine with a two weeks face to face courses and partnership learning – teaching experience. In order to assure a good educational, technical, administrative, financial and natural environment for the course the IP will be held in Sinaia Educational Centre of the University of Bucharest, between 20 March – 2 April, 2011.</p> <p>The subjects of the IP course are real case studies and related to real problems and situations in the field of nature conservation, water management, waste management, rural development, communication of sustainable development, coastal erosion, geoconservation, environmental pressure and life quality, climate change. These case studies assure a continuous contact and cooperation with local administrations, stakeholders, associations and universities from Europe and a way to promote the results of the project.</p> <p>The direct beneficiary of the project are 31 second cycle (MSc) and third cycle (PhD) students. The students selected are participants of the 2010 / 2011 EVS course, students from University of Bucharest following the new GB-NCHC MSc programme and PhD students. Also other EVS and MSc students and staff form partner institution will take advantages from the IP outcomes and impact.</p> <p>The IP has full recognition as part of the EVS framework. The IP has clear educational objectives and the students` work will be assessed by 17 teaching staff both from scientific and qualitative point of view and after completion of the courses they will receive a joint certificate and 4 ECTS for EVS (October – March 2011) and a joint certificate and 6 ECTS for the IP course (March 2011). All the credits are recognised by the partner universities.</p>

	<p>All the outputs (case studies, students' reports, web page, book, guidebooks, e-learning materials, reports, learning experience, management skills) will be integrated within partner educational strategies and in the EVS and MSc courses and used during next academic years. At a larger scale the IP will be connected with other similar educational programmes of the partner institutions and will have effects on improving the learning and teaching strategies, evaluation criteria, development of international courses. The subject proposed in this intensive programme is innovative for several domains of activities. During the IP a SWOT analysis of existing opportunities in correlation with each university development strategy will allow to the partnership to produce a Report about the opportunities, resources, framework for a possible European MSc common programme to be developed by the partner institutions.</p> <p>Management activities, monitoring, evaluation procedures, financial and decisional transparency and good results in terms of education, impact, students' motivation and partnership development will create the framework for a renewal IP.</p>

Description	<p>Objectives and target groups</p> <p>This IP project aims to improve and complete the academic professional training of undergraduates students (BA) from the specialities of engineering, manufacturing and processing and transportation. The scope is to support the bachelor students (1st cycle) in acquiring the core technical knowledge, skills and competences necessary to operate in their future profession, in a multidisciplinary and modern approach of logistics and maintenance issues as a support function for industrial systems.
