

**Title of Masters Course****EURO CULTURE****Duration:** 1 year 4 months**Course description:**

This Master's Course aims to prepare European and international graduates for professions in which the knowledge of contemporary Europe and the European Union (EU) institutions are of relevance. Students of this programme will also enhance their ability to create projects and joint ventures between EU and third countries. The focus of the programme is on cultural and social developments, with a focus on history, norms, values, and citizenship. Both theoretical knowledge and practical skills will be developed

The consortium offering this Master's programme is made up of the universities of Deusto (Spain), Gottingen (Germany), Groningen (the Netherlands), Krakow (Poland), Olomouc (Czech Republic) and Uppsala (Sweden). Students will spend terms at two different universities. The length of the full-time programme is 16 months.

The programme has four main components: core fields of European culture, "Eurocompetences" (practical skills including an internship), a ten-day Intensive Programme, and a research component. The core fields of European culture will be taught, analysed and discussed according to the following four interrelated concepts: Mobility (analyses people, communities and cultures in local and global contexts), Transfer (analyses cultural meanings and values in social interrelations), Intervention (analyses policies, programmes of action) and Co-operation (analyses implications of cross-cultural co-operation in trans-national projects).

The language of instruction varies according to the institutions chosen by the students. The programme involves 40 professors and around 120 students (limited to 20 students per university). Upon completion, the consortium universities provide a double degree.

Applicants must have a good level first-cycle degree in a discipline of relevance to Euroculture, a recognised level of proficiency in the language(s) of instruction, and be able to provide evidence of motivation and research/work experience.
