Interactive initiatives that empower citizens and business to influence open government, policy-making and the way public administrations operate and deliver services.

Public service initiatives contributing to improve the social environment and social cohesion. Services can be local, national, or European; useroriented, inclusive, and interoperable.

Effective and efficient administration

Innovations or reorganisations in services and processes, which make administrations more efficient and effective and reduce administrative burden.

Most inspiring Good Practice*

Initiatives that provide creative solutions to common challenges inspiring others.
