SHORT SUMMARY OF CONCLUSIONS OF THE 19TH MEETING OF THE SCIENTIFIC REVIEW GROUP ON TRADE IN WILD FAUNA AND FLORA¹

HELD IN BRUSSELS ON 26 MARCH 2001

The SRG took the following decisions under Articles 4.1(a)(i) and 4.2.(a) of Regulation 338/97 :
