

**SHORT SUMMARY OF CONCLUSIONS OF THE 36<sup>TH</sup> MEETING OF THE SCIENTIFIC  
REVIEW GROUP ON TRADE IN WILD FAUNA AND FLORA<sup>1</sup>  
9 MARCH 2006**

The SRG took the following decisions under Articles 4.1(a)(i) and 4.2(a) of Council Regulation (EC) N° 338/97:

7) **Export quota:** while a further review of export quota for 2006 is scheduled for SRG37, the SRG agreed that applications of the following species were to be referred tot the SRG:

- Indonesia: *Cheilinus undulatus*, *Hippocampus kelloggi*, *Malayemys subtrijuga*, *Notochelys platynota*
- Nicaragua: *Strombus gigas*
- Uzbekistan: *Capra falconeri*

For Scleractinia from Tonga, the SRG agreed on a negative opinion for *Platygyra sinensis* while it further confirmed the approach agreed at SRG32 to assess other species from Tonga by taking into account the distribution and possible trade measures for these species in neighbouring countries, when information on the distribution and trade of the species in Tonga was not available.

*Pericopsis elata* / Cameroon: The SRG noted the new management structures in Cameroon relating to forestry and trade. The SRG retained the positive opinion, noting the recent information Cameroon had sent to the CITES Secretariat under the Significant Trade Review process and that the country is committed to implement the CITES recommendations to establish sustainable export quota for this species. Further information on how the quota was established would be requested from Cameroon.

*Gonystylus* spp. / Malaysia: The SRG noted the arrangements in Malaysia on the management of these species and it would continue the dialogue with the country on further developments and implementation of 'non detriment findings', the export quota and the use of the generic name for these species.

*Swietenia macrophylla* / Peru: The SRG agreed to assess the situation further after a mission to that country scheduled to take place around the next Plants Committee meeting (July 2006).

The SRG agreed to the view of the CITES Nomenclature Committee that *Pachypodium makayense* should be treated as subspecies of *Pachypodium rosulatum* i.e. *Pachypodium rosulatum makayense*. The present suspension for *Pachypodium rosulatum* therefore applies to the subspecies as well.

The SRG agreed on criteria for inclusion of species on Annex D which would serve as working criteria when assessing and reviewing species for this annex.
