### Introduction

The Directorate General for Environment of the European Commission organises a Soil event in EXPO 2015 in Milan on 20<sup>th</sup> October. This event is one of main contributions of the European Commission to the International Year of Soils 2015 aiming at raising awareness on the importance of healthy soils for healthy life.
