Article 14(1) ESF Regulation

What is it?

- An empowerment to allow the Commission adopt Simplified Cost Options using a Delegated Act
- Can apply to any Member State for any types of operations

Why use it?

- Legal Certainty
- Accounting practices
- Can cover more types of operations





Article 14(1) ESF Regulation

- While there is no obligation to act for the Commission...
- there is a strong political commitment from the Commission to support MS in implementing SCOs.
- Unit costs and lump sums included in the DA could be
 - Proposed by an individual Member State based on its own data
 - Proposed by the Commission for a number or all Member States, based on for example Eurostat data.





The Delegated Regulation

Articles 1 to 4 cover:

- Subject matter and scope
- Types of operations
- Definitions of standard scales of unit costs and lump sums and their amounts
- Adjustment of amounts

Annex:

- One for each Member State
- Indicator definition, measurement unit and amount
- Adjustment of amounts





The story so far...

- Delegated Regulation 2015/2195
- amended 4x
- covering 14 Member States
- EU-level SCOs for education





Post 5th amendment (DA+)

18 Member
States
~ EUR 9 BN







DA: 5th amendment adopted by Commission on 28th May 2018

- New annexes for Croatia, Ireland, Spain and the United Kingdom
- Amending existing annexes for France, Czech Republic, Malta, Slovakia and Cyprus
- Amending the existing annex for EU-level SCOs on education





Croatia:

1 new unit cost for teaching assistants

Ireland:

 5 new unit costs for training of unemployed people (provided by the Education and Training Boards)

Spain:

Unit costs for vocational training courses (SEPE registered)





United Kingdom:

Unit costs for apprenticeships (OP Northern Ireland)

France:

 Unit costs for training of unemployed people provided by accredited training organisations (OP Île-de-France, Rhône-Alpes & Auvergne)





Czech Republic:

- Unit costs for mobility of researchers
- Unit costs for mobility of educational staff
- Unit costs for teaching assistants

Malta:

• 5 new unit costs for training measures & preparation classes for specific exams (Youth Guarantee)





Slovakia:

 Update of amount for UC 5 (Integration of pupils in kindergartens and schools)

Cyprus:

 Unit costs for the provision of a disability and functionality assessment





EU-level SCOs on education - clarifications on:

- **Scope:** Formal education and training operations (from early childhood education to tertiary level incl. formal vocational education and training) in all ESF OPs.
- **Costs:** All eligible costs directly related to providing core goods and services of education or training.

and Inclusion

• **Duration:** Part-time courses now explicitly included



Conclusion

- Article 14.1 ESF DA extremely popular with national authorities (18 Member States covered & EUR 9 Billion)
- Real simplification on the ground.
- The European Parliament has been a very supportive of this process
- Commission will propose more amendments in the coming months
