April 2017

Annual inflation up to 1.9% in the euro area


Up to 2.0% in the EU

Euro area annual inflation was 1.9% in April 2017, up from 1.5% in March. In April 2016 the rate was -0.2%. **European Union** annual inflation was 2.0% in April 2017, up from 1.6% in March. A year earlier the rate was -0.2%. These figures come from **Eurostat**, the statistical office of the European Union.

The lowest annual rates were registered in **Romania** (0.6%), **Ireland** (0.7%) and **Slovakia** (0.8%). The highest annual rates were recorded in **Estonia** (3.6%), **Lithuania** (3.5%) and **Latvia** (3.3%). Compared with March 2017, annual inflation fell in six Member States, remained stable in three and rose in nineteen.

The largest upward impacts to **euro area** annual inflation came from fuels for transport (+0.39 percentage points), package holidays (+0.12 pp) and heating oil (+0.11 pp), while telecommunication (-0.11 pp), garments (-0.08 pp) and bread & cereals (-0.05 pp) had the biggest downward impacts.

Inflation rates (%) measured by the HICP



Geographical coverage

The **euro area** consists of Belgium, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Portugal, Slovenia, Slovakia and Finland.

The **European Union** includes Belgium, Bulgaria, the Czech Republic, Denmark, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Croatia, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Hungary, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovenia, Slovakia, Finland, Sweden and the United Kingdom.

The euro area and European Union data refer to the respective country compositions at a specific point in time. New Member States are integrated into the aggregates using a chain index formula.

Methods and definitions

The **annual rate** measures the change of the Harmonised Indices of Consumer Prices (HICP) between a month and the same month of the previous year, and the **monthly rate** compares the indices between the two latest months.

An **impact** is a measure showing the change in the inflation due to the inclusion of a sub-index. The impact takes account of both the weight and whether the inflation for that sub-index is higher or lower than the all-items inflation rate.

Revisions and timetable

A flash estimate of euro area inflation is issued at the end of each reference month. The euro area <u>flash estimate for April 2017</u>, published on 28 April 2017, was 1.9%.

The next flash estimate of euro area inflation with data for May 2017 is scheduled for 31 May 2017.
