

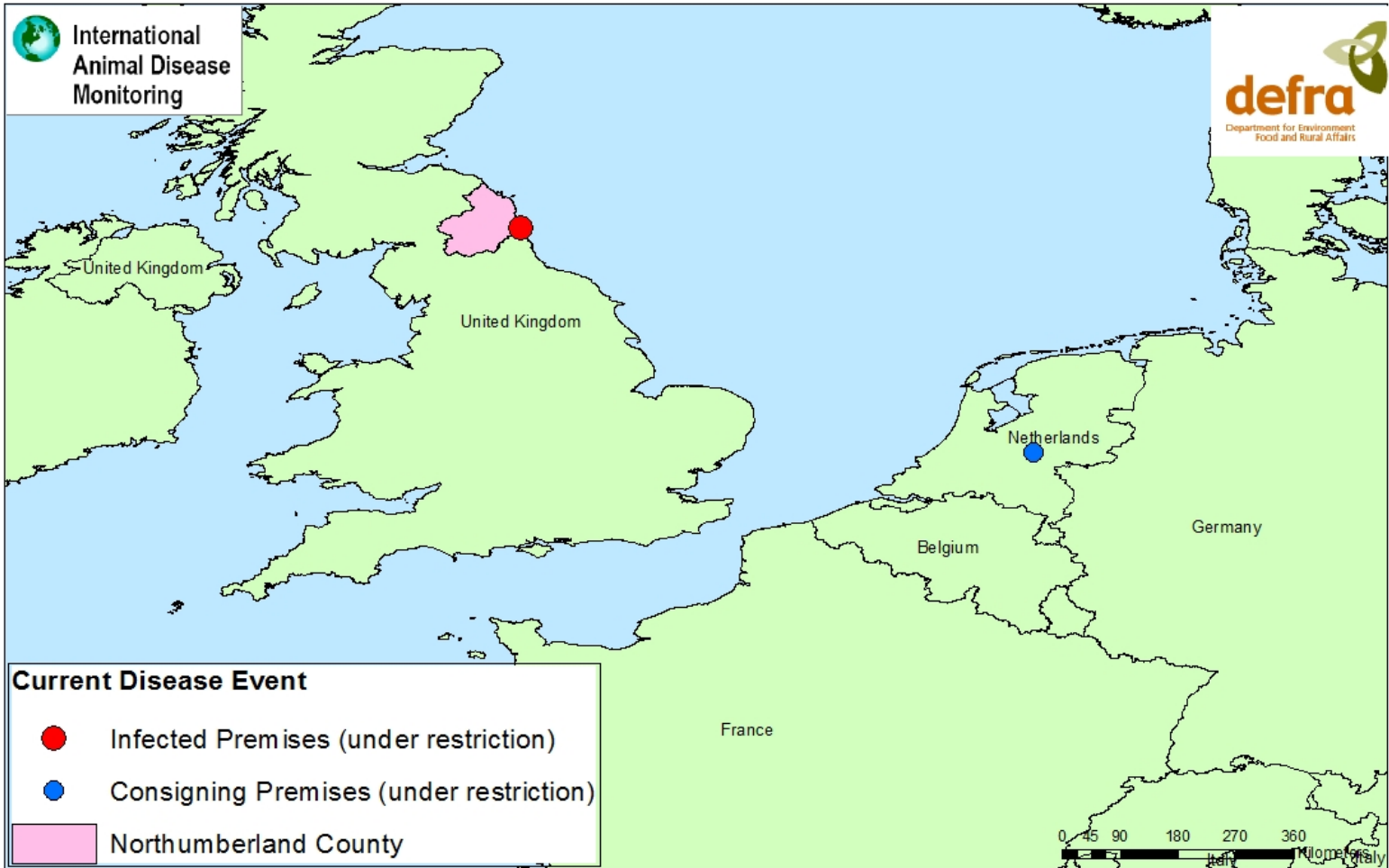
Equine Infectious Anaemia in GB (England)

SCoFCAH 11th-12th October 2010

Chronology

- 14th August - TRACES notification of consignment of 9 non-thoroughbred horses from Netherlands.
- 27th August - Post import checks for compliance with certification detected irregularities in the certification. Restricted and sampled for EIA.
- 6th September - CVO confirmed EIA in one horse (positive Coggins)
- 7th September – CVO phoned COM and CVO Netherlands. Infected euthanized.
- 10th September – formal notification to OIE and EU.
- Further laboratory studies indicated horse infected prior to movement.
- Premises remains under restrictions. All in-contact tested negative.

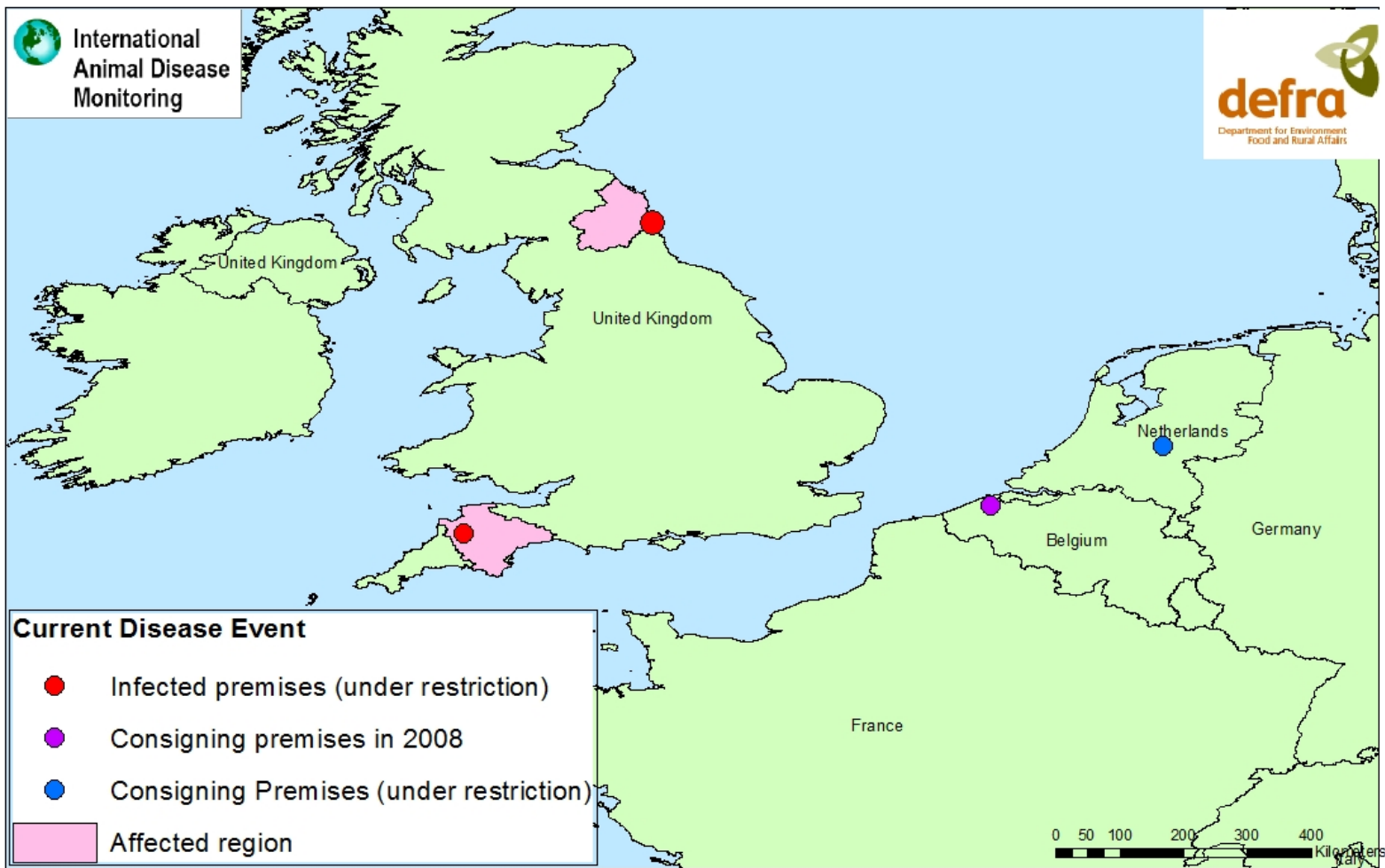

Chronology

- 7th September – Private vet reported clinical signs in a horse in Devon. Samples taken.
- 8th September - Private vet lab report of anaemia and thrombocytopaenia. Restrictions served.
- 9th September – 2nd sampling for EIA to official lab.
- 11th September – EIA confirmed in clinically affected horse. Official notification to COM and OIE. Infected horse euthanized.
- Further laboratory studies indicated horse not viraemic for EIA, co-infection with piroplasmosis indicated.
- Horse originally from Belgium (moved in April, 2008).
- In-contact horses and donkeys at a contiguous premises tested negative
- Premises remains under restrictions

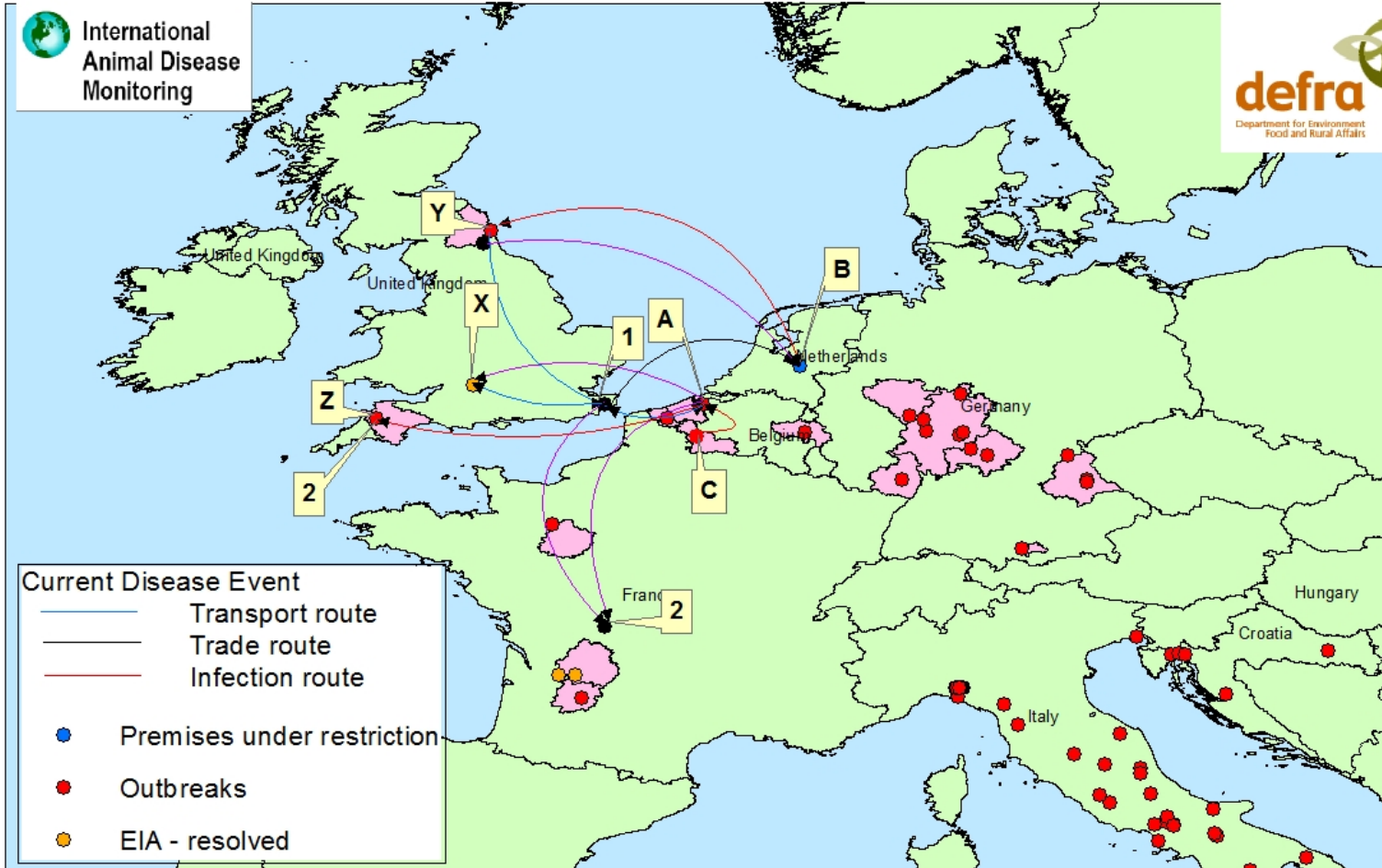
- Both infected horses (Devon and Northumberland) have been euthanized.
- Neither horse showed any signs of viraemia for EIA.
- All in contact horses are negative for EIA but remain restricted and will be re-tested at 90 days.
- No restriction zones or additional surveillance carried out, on epidemiologists advice.
- Heightened vigilance remains in place in the UK.
- Risk of onward transmission is considered to be negligible.
- Intelligence has been provided to COM and other MSs on a network of dealers.

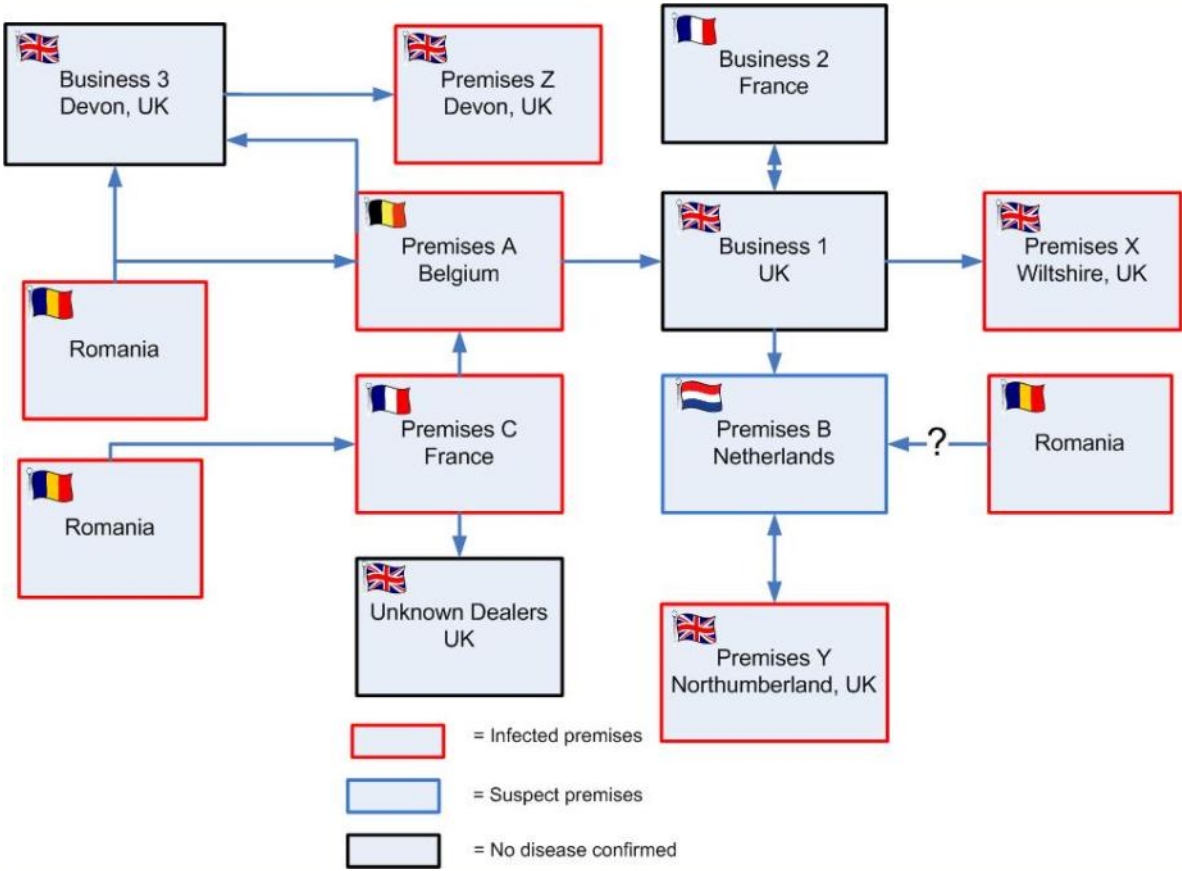
