The association "Paris Without Tobacco", created in 1991, is supporting a <u>total ban</u> on <u>smoking in all enclosed public places and workplaces without exemptions.</u> This <u>total ban</u> is the only way to ensure a total protection against the health effects of the secondary tobacco smoke. It prevents costly expenditures for smoking rooms and prevents undue competition between bars, restaurants, casinos...

The association "Paris Without Tobacco" supports the option of a European Directive on this matter. This European Directive will be a minimum to prevent any regression of any national legislation. Secondary tobacco smoke being scientifically recognised as a human carcinogen, all directives and regulations of carcinogenic products have to be applied to eliminate exposure.
