SCIENTIFIC COMMITTEE ON HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENTAL RISKS (SCHER) 15TH PLENARY MEETING

Held on 30 January 2007 in Brussels MINUTES

1. WELCOME AND APOLOGIES

Prof. Greim, Chair of the Committee, opened the meeting and welcomed the participants.

Apologies: Prof Jansson, Prof Sokal, Prof. Tarazona

2. ADOPTION OF THE DRAFT AGENDA

The draft agenda was adopted as written.

3. DECLARATION OF INTEREST ON MATTERS ON THE AGENDA

Prof C. Janssen declared a conflict of interest in relation to item 7.1 since he was heavily involved in consultation on the report from both competent authorities and industry. Taking into account the nature of the declarations, the committee decided that he could not participate in the working group.

P Calow declared a possible conflict of interest since he was chairman of the NiPERA (Nickel Producers Environmental Research Association) risk assessment report peer review group and in the same group the zinc industry was present as observer.

Prof. Linders declared a possible conflict of interest in relation to the same item being The Netherlands Member State rapporteur for the RAR on zinc. Taking into account the nature of the declarations, the Committee decided that he could not be nominated as possible Rapporteur of the opinion on zinc.

He also declared a conflict of interest in relation to item 8.2 since he was involved in the RIVM assessment on copper and in drafting the letter of reaction to the CSTEE opinion. The committee decided that he would not be involved in the discussion.

Prof. Mangelsdorf declared a possible conflict of interest in relation to item 8.3 due to her involvement in a UPA project on emission of chemicals from building materials.

4. APPROVAL OF THE DRAFT MINUTES OF THE 14TH SCHER PLENARY MEETING

The $\underline{\text{minutes}}$ of the 14th SCHER plenary meeting were adopted with minor corrections.

5. CHAIR'S REPORT

5.1 Chairs meeting

The Chair briefly summarized on issues discussed at the last ICCG and informed the Committee on the points to be discussed in the ICCG meeting on the day after.

5.2 SETAC

The Chairs informed the Committee on the number of presentations proposed by SCHER members to the next SETAC meeting.

5.3 Publications

One of the members volunteered to propose some opinions at the next plenary meeting for publication in a Scientific Journal.

6. NEW REQUESTS ON REGULATION 793/93 EXISTING SUBSTANCES (ESR): (HUMAN HEALTH AND/OR ENVIRONMENT) – DG ENV/DG JRC

A Rapporteur was appointed to comment on the Risk Assessment Reports (RAR) on hexachlorocyclopentadiene (HCCP; CAS 77-47-4; HH).

7. ONGOING REQUESTS ON REGULATION 793/93 EXISTING SUBSTANCES (ESR): (HUMAN HEALTH AND/OR ENVIRONMENT) – DG ENV/JRC

7.1 Zinc (ENV)

The rapporteur reported back from the first WG meeting on zinc which was mostly focused on the scoping and the need for external experts.

A few names were proposed but the group decided it did not wish to invite them to participate in the group on the basis of their past or current funding from the zinc industry. The Committee agreed that for the time being the group would include only the SCHER members as decided in the previous plenary and external experts would be possibly considered in due course, if proposed.

7.2 Chlorodifluoromethane (HH)

7.4 Methenamine (HH)

A preliminary draft opinion on the results of the human health part of the RAR on methenamine was presented by the rapporteur. It would be checked for some references and proposed at the next plenary meeting for possible adoption.

8. ONGOING REQUESTS FOR OPINIONS BY COMMISSION SERVICES ON:

8.1 Non surfactant Organic Ingredients and Zeolite-based Detergents

The Rapporteur briefly reported back from the first working group meeting. A committee member, expert in the field of human toxicology accepted to join the group. The next WG meeting would be held in March.

8.2 Copper in antifouling paint

The SCHER revisited the previous CSTEE opinion and the comments submitted by the Dutch Authorities, and as a general conclusion considered that the concerns expressed by the CSTEE have only partially been covered by the Dutch response.

The SCHER was of the opinion that the risk assessment performed by the Dutch government to justify the draft measure notified to the Commission did not provide sufficient sound scientific evidence to show that the use of copper-based antifouling paints in leisure boats presents significant environmental risks.
