The decision sets up three scientific advisory committees in the field of consumer safety, public health and the environment: the Scientific Committee on Consumer Products (SCCP), the Scientific Committee on Health and Environmental Risks (SCHER) and the Scientific Committee on Emerging and Newly Identified Health risks (SCENIHR). These scientific committees will replace the existing scientific committees established by Decision 97/579/EC (i.e. the CSTEE, SCCNFP and SCMPMD).
