- it involves all key actors (Institutions, Academic world, NGOs, Youth)


Why a Policy Guide?



Recurrent themes

- Quality of information and services
- Variety of settings and providers
- Comprehensiveness and range of choices
- Affordability
- Training and support for staff
- Clients' rights
- Need for protection policies

Policy Area 1: Information, Education and Communication

Provide young people with knowledge, skills, attitudes to make informed choices, now and in the future

- Recognize sexuality of YP from all angles
- Appropriate methodologies and approaches
- Nurture positive attitudes and values
- Age-appropriate information

Develop life skills

Support parents & families

Policy Area 2: Health services

Meet the SRH needs of YOUNG PEOPLE with high quality services provided in an appropriate manner and in a comfortable and safe environment

- Easy and discreet access
- **Flexible opening hours**
- Counselling
- **Effective referral system**
- Provide for needs of young men and women

Policy area 3: Access to Contraception

Provide access to a wide but suitable range of contraceptives so that YP can control their lives while safeguarding their health

■ Information about methods

- Easily available and affordable
- Confidentiality

Policy Area 4: STIs and HIV/AIDS

Enable YP to protect themselves against STIs and to have access to high quality- and effective treatment

Prevention and services

■ Decriminalisation

- Access to condoms, dual protection
- Needs for specific groups

Prevention for/with YP living with HIV

HIV and STIs

- Resurgence in unprotected sex or sexual risk behaviour
- Aids fatigue
- Need for NEW and more effective Prevention prgrammes:
- Access to information and sexuality education (S&D)
- Promotion of CONDOM & Gender policy

- AIDS no longer a killer disease
- Sexual and reproductive rights of PLWH
- S& D Positive prevention
- ESABLISH COORDINATED MULTISECTORAL RESPONCE
- INTEGRATE SRHR AND HIV PROGRAMMES
- (improved acces to and uptake of services; reduce stigma; protection of SRHR of PLWH

VULNERABLE GROUPS

- Changing patterns of transmission- unprotected sex
- Migration of people from regions with generalised epidemics
- URGENT and SENSITIVE
- MSM
- IDUs (and partners) es in YP recreational iD
- Sex workers (and clients)
- PLWH
