I am secretary of the Dancing Eye Syndrome support trust in the UK. I do have a comment to make on the consultation paper but I am not quite sure which question to relate it to, maybe number 1 'definition of rare'. Dancing Eye Syndrome (otherwise know as Opsoclonus Myoclonus Syndrome or Kinsbourne syndrome) is a rare disorder certainly satisfying the prevalence criteria. It is a paraneoplastic condition which means it is sometimes associated with neuroblastoma. A recent research grant application was turned down by the EU rare disease project. One of the reasons given was because cancer (the neuroblastoma) was not classed as a rare condition and Dancing Eye Syndrome could not be classed as a rare disease because of its association with cancer. In fact a lot of paraneoplastic conditions are rare and so maybe ought to have consideration.
