Future situation

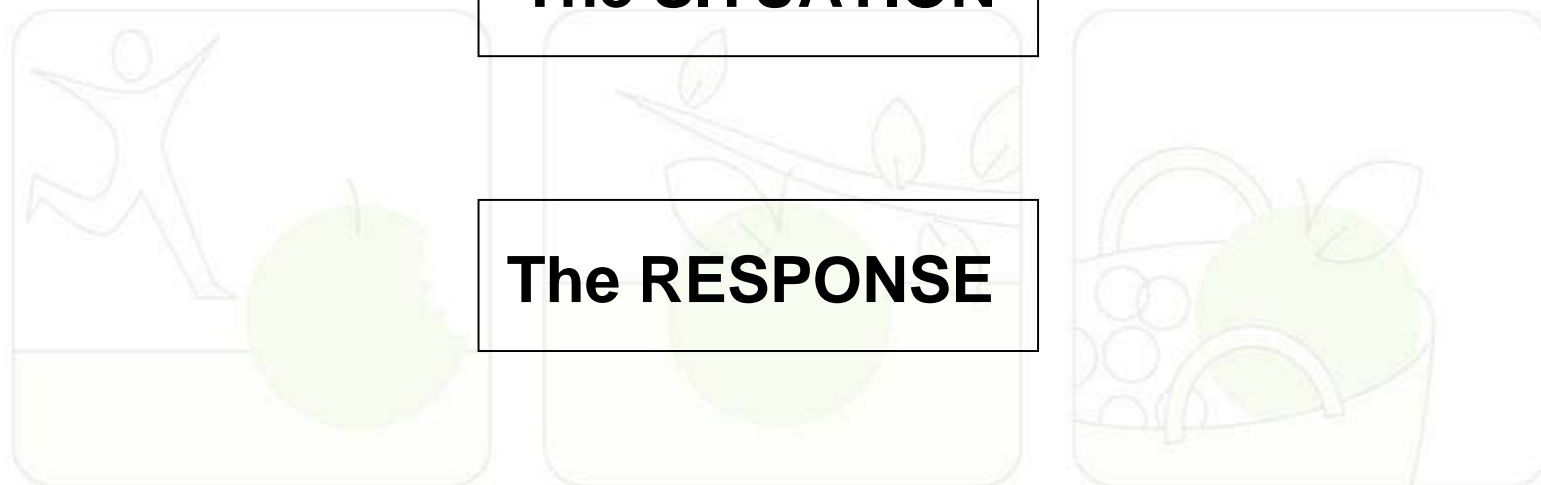
- Communication from the Commission, 2010 – 2014

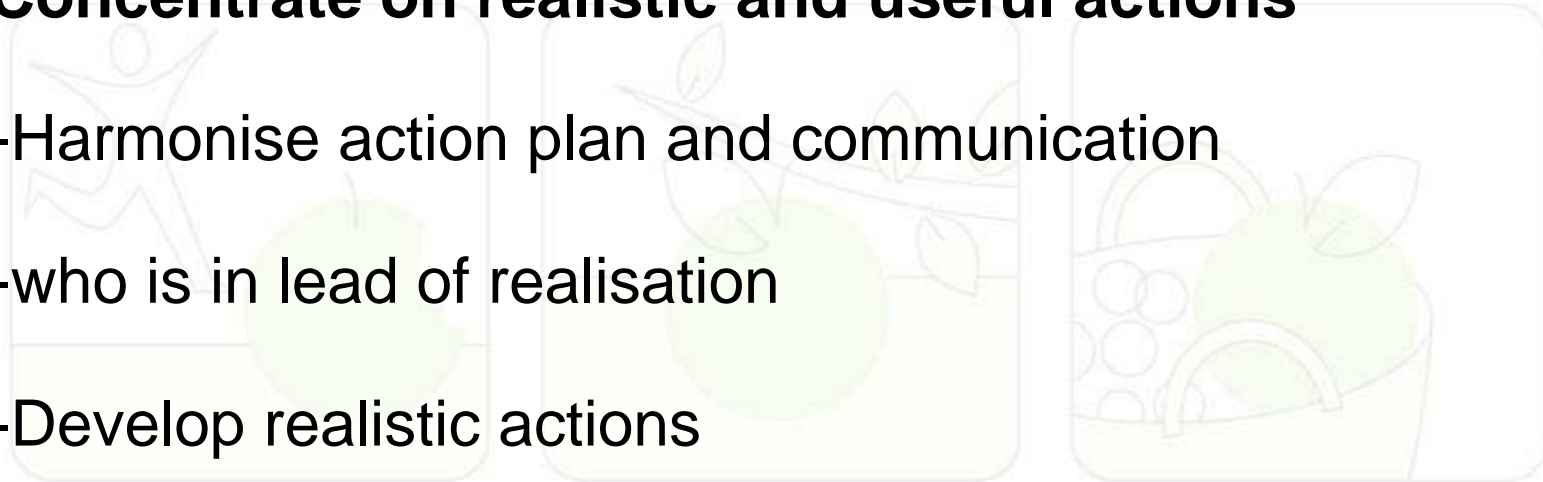
Focus on priorities and stay targeted
