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Introduction

This questionnaire is part of the research project "Treatment of Mentally III or Disordered Persons in European Prison Systems – Needs, Programmes and Outcomes", funded by the European Commission (Agreement No. 2004106 EUPRIS).

This project aims at describing and analysing the frequency of incarceration of mentally ill or disordered persons in the prison system across the included nations. Moreover it evaluates the service provision for mentally ill or disordered prison inmates and its outcome (e.g. in terms of suicide rates, suicidal behaviour, drug abuse, alcoholism etc.). The purpose of this questionnaire is to gather relevant information in a standardised format for 23 out of 25 EU-Member States; the EFTA states of Iceland and Norway, and in Bulgaria (all in all 26 countries)

The questions concern nationwide official information and its availability (health reporting or juridical data) with regard to **adult mentally ill or disordered prisoners**. The treatment of mentally disordered children or adolescents is considered to be a separate problem, which this study does not primarily focus upon. Similarly, the treatment or placement of persons having committed a crime under the influence of a mental disorder ("mentally ill offenders") is also **not** an issue pertinent to this project.

This questionnaire gathers information from 26 countries, most of which probably differ in their approaches towards or their history of psychiatric treatment or legal systems or traditions. Due to these differences, some items in this questionnaire might deal with certain aspects only on a global level in order to cover all the countries involved. Thus, some items might fail to satisfactorily describe special aspects in your own country. If you miss any descriptions relevant for comprehension of your national prison system, please endorse an additional sheet.


