SCIENTIFIC COMMITTEE ON CONSUMER PRODUCT (SCCP)

Request for a scientific opinion: Fragrances Citral (CAS 5392-40-5), Farnesol (CAS 4602-84-0) and Phenylacetaldehyde (CAS 122-78-1) Submission I

1. Background

Submission I on Citral (CAS 5392-40-5), Farnesol (CAS 4602-84-0) and Phenylacetaldehyde (CAS 122-78-1) is part of the fragrance issue.

SCCNFP¹/SCCP was asked, whether they agree to include all IFRA² restricted materials in the Annex III (list of substances which cosmetic products must not contain except subject to restrictions and conditions laid down) of the Cosmetic Directive. To that end EFFA³ was asked to submit safety files concerning the sensitising properties.

The restrictions for the substances citral, farnesol and phenylaceal dehyde are set in the IFRA standards $40^{\rm th}$ amendment.

The proposed concentration limits for the above mentioned substances are given in the submission of the standards. The limitation in the finished cosmetic products differs with products category. 11 different categories exist whereas category 1-9 concern cosmetic products. The description of the categories has to be found in the QRA booklet.

Citral is currently regulated for labelling purposes in Annex III, 70, when present in a concentration above 10ppm for leave-on products and above 100ppm for rinse-off products. The IFRA restrictions for Citral, currently given in the Inventory part II, are: "Only in conjunction with 25% its weight of D-limonene or mixed with citrus terpenes or α -pinene."

Farnesol is currently regulated for labelling purposes in Annex III, 82, when present in a concentration above 10ppm for leave-on products and above 100ppm for rinse-off products. No IFRA restrictions for this substance are currently given in the Inventory.

For Phenylacetaldehyde, the IFRA restrictions currently given in the Inventory part II, is: "Only in conjunction with an equal weight phenethyl alcohol or dipropyleneglycol or other substances preventing sensitization."

This submission is the first evaluation of fragrances following the exposure-based quantitative risk assessment methodology (QRA).

To facilitate the work DG ENTR has prepare the schema below which shows the concentrations limits of the substances in the individual product categories, proposed by the EFFA
