Multi-sectoral Annual Work Programme / call Eligibility

- ➤ CEF Regulation (article 17(7): Commission to adopt at least one multi-sectoral call for proposals
- ➤ Article 7(5): actions with synergies between sectors contributing to projects of common interest eligible under **at least two** of the sectoral EU Guidelines shall be eligible to receive CEF financial assistance for the purpose of multi-sectoral calls for proposals

> Conditions:

- Actions to meet TEN-T objectives and to contribute to projects on the 2nd energy PCI list
- CEF funding with transport and energy budget-lines weighted according to the action's respective eligible costs
- Clear separation of components and costs of the action per sector



Objectives and Priorities

The general objective is to support the deployment of sustainable and efficient transport and energy infrastructure through the creation of synergies.

- As to location, synergy actions should be deployed on the comprehensive network for transport with emphasis along the core network corridors, while complying with the energy infrastructure corridors and areas, in line with the TEN-T and the TEN-E Guidelines and Annexes thereto.
- > Synergy actions should support the implementation of the PCIs contained in the second Union list of PCIs (2nd PCI list) in the energy sector, within the scope of the global and generic objectives and priorities defined in this Work Programme.



Scope of call for proposals

- Synergies call is seen as a pilot-exercise which may be replicated in the future if successful
- ➤ Synergies call will provide input to CEF mid-term evaluation (Article 27 of CEF Regulation Commission report to Council and EP by end 2017) and shape proposals for CEF 2
- ➤ Transport innovation-related projects which are not eligible to synergies call, given eligibility constraints, may be put forward under upcoming CEF transport call (13 October): EUR 80 million under General envelope and almost EUR 60 million under Cohesion envelope
