



## ENN-ICS

**ENN-ICS helps people and medical professionals treat and better manage sleep disorders. Its interactive, multilingual website supports inclusive patient care while building a network of sleep disorder medical professionals across Europe.**

Sleep problems are a major burden for working adults, children, the elderly and disabled people. Their negative impacts on mental, psychological and body functions have repercussions that underscore the importance of sleep medicines, education and training.

European Neurological Network – Interactive Communication System (ENN-ICS) is an eHealth project integrating advanced technologies with the goal to offer a new multilingual, regional and multinational service in the field of Sleep and Sleep Disorders.

The overall objectives of ENN-ICS are:

- Create an EU-wide training network of doctors, nurses and students dealing with Sleep Disorders
- Provide practical support to one third of European citizens via direct, on-line and on-demand personalized information and orientation
- Decrease the high medical and societal costs by improving sleep in the European population, with visible repercussions on healthcare budget and society well being
- Support less privileged people through patient associations and NGOs, therefore enhancing social cohesion

The core dissemination media, ENN-ICS' internet site, provides content to help people and medical professionals treat and better manage sleep disorders. The site also provides online support, disseminates information on sleep disorders and acts a sales distribution centre for DVDs/CDs and printed material.
