eRMIONE delivers European cultural heritage materials to online courses to bring enriched cultural exchanges to students from different countries. The e-Learning Resource Management tools benefit student learning and allow for more trans-European cooperation.

Europe must seek innovative ways to preserve its unique cultural heritage for future generations by creating online learning environments where students from different countries can cooperate with each other. Until recently the applications were not available to achieve this in an effective way that benefits students.

eRMIONE is an e-learning resource management service that delivers European cultural heritage material online to teachers so they can find new ways to capture students' imagination and continued interest in culture. The service allows students from different universities to participate in online courses together in multi-cultural education programmes and to share their experiences.

The objectives of this e-learning project include:

- Set up and start up pilot sites whose output will be the release of customised and localised eRMIONE services according to users' requirements.
- Fully validate and refine the eRMIONE service to prepare it for commercialisation.
- Define the strategies to address the service's target market of Higher Education Institutions in Europe.

The final output of the project will be an e-learning solution for cultural heritage education at Higher Education Institutions across Europe, a well-defined segment.
