

Lubomira Hromkova, graduated in Journalism studies (1995) and Law (1997) – professionally devoted to EU issues from 1995. Her work experience began in the Department for European Integration of the Ministry for Privatisation in Slovakia. In 1997 she begins to work in the Office of the Slovak Government where she becomes responsible for the implementation of the Pre-accession strategy. She became responsible for the National Programme for the Adoption of the Acquis Communautaire in Slovakia and reports on Slovakia's progress towards the Copenhagen criteria. In 2000 she entered in the diplomatic service of the Slovak Ministry of Foreign Affairs. She actively participated in the negotiation process of Slovakia into the EU (chapters: Free movement of goods; Freedom to provide services; Company law; Consumer Protection). In first semester 2002 she was nominated the special diplomat for the Spanish Presidency in the EU. After the Spanish Presidency she returned back to the Slovak Embassy in Madrid to continue her diplomatic mission with responsibility for EU affairs. After four years spent in Spain she was nominated the Head of Unit for Economic and Financial Policy of the EU in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. From March 2007 she started to work for the European Commission, DG INFSO, Unit ICT for Health, in order to continue her specialisation in European Law. She deals with legal issues related to eHealth.

She has lectured EU law and EU policies in Law Faculty in Bratislava, Law Faculty in Trnava, City University, Ltd. Bratislava, Academia Istropolitana NOVA in Bratislava, Universidad de Salamanca, Universidad de Alcalá Henares and Universidad Francisco Vitoria in Madrid.
