The CIP:

- a (new) programme to boost growth and jobs in Europe
- budget ~3.6B€ (2007-2013)
- Three pillars (specific programmes)

& Innovation**

~2,170 M€
(incl € 430 eco-innovation)

**ICT Policy
Support programme**

EU ICT policy framework: The i2010 initiative

- Flagship policy initiative for the renewed Lisbon agenda
 - Comprehensive and holistic approach for ICT policy
- Objective: Enable Europe to exploit the full potential of ICTs and media for growth and employment
- Three interlinked priorities:
 - Completing the Single European Information Space
 - Strengthening innovation and investment in research
 - Achieving an Inclusive European Information society

i2010 instruments

- Legislation, regulation
- Coordination, consensus-building
- Financial support:
 - Two distinct and complementary financial instruments
 - **ICT PSP**: To drive forward innovation through the best use and wider adoption of ICTs
 - ICT in FP7: To strengthen Europe's leadership role in mastering and shaping the development of ICTs

- ICT PSP (~730 M€ for 2007-13), indicative profile

ICT PSP – Work Programme:

- Annual work programme
 - The key document for implementing the programme
 - WP is approved by the CIP ICT Committee
- Thematic priorities
 - Objectives (characterization and expected impact)
- Implementation measures
 - Funding instruments, rules for participation
 - Evaluation process and criteria
- Timetable & indicative budget
- WP is complemented by other documents providing guidances to users

WP 2008: Input

- CIP Legislative text
- Policy priorities in i2010
 - Flagship initiatives,..
 - i2010 HLG
- Ad hoc groups and groups of experts (MS)
 - i2010 groups
- Experience from previous programmes
 - Evaluation/monitoring of projects achievements
- Innovation policy priorities
 - A broad based- innovation strategy for Europe (response to Aho report)

Synthesis of input received

1: Status of ICT uptake

- In the private sector:
 - Large companies fully aware of ICT potential
 - SMEs can benefit more from latest ICT innovations
- In areas of services of public interest
 - Europe caught up in general with competitors. But
 - we are far from exploiting ICT potential
 - MSs are at different levels
 - More needs to be done
 - to ensure interoperability, EU-wide deployment
 - to learn from each other
 - to support new policy initiatives
 - including achieving the internal market
 - to provide new solutions to Europe's key societal challenges
 - Health, ageing, environment, energy, mobility, security

Synthesis of input received 2: Where to intervene?

- In the private sector, mainly for:
 - awareness raising
 - experience sharing
- In areas of services of public interest:
 - interoperability
 - avoiding market fragmentation
 - facilitating the development of EU-wide ICT lead markets
 - sharing experience and risk in new solutions
- For both:
 - monitoring, benchmarking and follow up

Synthesis of input received

3: How to intervene?

- Prepare for wider actions
 - Consensus and partnership building is essential for interoperability and EU-wide deployment
- Build on Member States initiatives
 - Share experience
 - Help develop common approaches
 - Ensure interoperability
- Develop show cases and tests
 - Pilot actions
- Diffuse widely the results
 - Ensure “replicability” and scalability

ICT PSP work programmes 2007 and 2008: Approach

- Focus:
 - To maximise impact
 - On areas where public support is needed
 - On areas where Community support is needed
- Balance between
 - Activities building on, and strengthening Member States actions
 - Activities stimulating new actions in public and private sector

WP2008: same structure as WP2007

- WP focused on a set of themes and horizontal actions
 - For each theme, an ultimate socio-economic goal is defined
- Themes and horizontal actions are addressed through a set of objectives
 - To be achieved through community contribution
- An objective is supported with
 1. Pilots building on, and strengthening Member States actions (focus on interoperability)
 2. Pilots stimulating new actions in the public and private sector
 3. Thematic Network (s)
 - Through Calls for Applicants
 - Awareness, benchmarking, conferences, Studies,
 - Through Calls for tenders or grants
