Overall Objective of 3.4

Empowering patients and supporting widespread deployment of telemedicine services

- Build on results of ongoing initiatives:
 - epSOS
 - Renewing Health
 - eHealth Governance Initiative
- Work towards DAE goals (KA13)
 - Undertake pilot actions to equip Europeans with secure online access to their medical health data by 2015
 - Achieve by 2020 widespread deployment of telemedicine services



3.4 a) empowering patients through secure online access by citizens to their medical / health records

- The objective is to validate services based on secure and user friendly online access by patients to their health data (in real life settings), to evaluate the benefits and prepare for their wider deployment.
- Who:
 - Minimum 4 independent legal entities from 4 different MS or Associated Countries
 - Key players involved in the provision of online eHealth services (incl. ebooking, referral tracking, chronic disease management support, repeat e-prescriptions...)
- What :
 - Health and economic evaluation of services
 - Business model for long term sustainability
 - Recommendations for minimum set of services and their EU-wide implementation

3.4 b) – Supporting widespread deployment of telemedicine services

- The objective is to facilitate good practice exchange; build stakeholder consensus; prepare commitments on actions to lift barriers to widespread telemedicine deployment
- Who:
 - Minimum 7 independent legal entities from 7 MS or Associated Countries
 - Experts: national telemedicine associations, MS and Associated Countries, patient organisations, health professional orgs
- What :
 - Specific guidelines to accelerate telemedicine deployment to achieve widespread deployment by 2020
 - Addressing legal, organisational, technical, market related issues
