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eHealth in ICT PSP Context

- National/Regional eHealth deployments indicating a need for a coherent approaches to interoperability, standardization, assessment
- Yearly eHealth Ministerial Conferences & Declarations (2003 -)
- EC Recommendation on cross border Interoperability of Electronic Health records (7/2008)
- eHealth Governance Initiative - State secretaries of Ministries of health agreed to cooperate on eHealth (10/2009)
- Council conclusions on safe and efficient healthcare through eHealth – adopted by EPSCO Council on Dec 1st 2009

Increased cooperation
between MS on eHealth DEPLOYMENT

Overall Objective 3.1 and 3.2

- **Build on results → epSOS II (3.1):** more MS (already 6 have formally applied), enlarging the scope – 7 Mill EUR
- Increased cooperation on eHealth (3.2 a/b):
 - Use a thematic network to create consensus and build knowledge on innovative eHealth services to be deployed on a large scale -500k
 - Build on the work of CALLIOPE to support further MS cooperation at political, strategic and operational level (EU eHealth Governance) - 500k

3.1- Enlargement of the pilot "epSOS" on eHealth Interoperability for patient's summaries and ePrescription

- **The objective** is to extend the currently running epSOS pilot by **increasing the number of Member States** participating in the pilot and by **enlarging the scope** of the proposed solutions to additional eHealth services
- Who:
 - At least 5 additional MS representatives
 - International organisations with a key role on Interoperability
- What:
 - How epSOS "building blocks" can be reused in other services (I.e. emergency services or eEHIC)
 - How 112 links /is interoperable with epSOS services
 - epSOS interoperability in the global context

- 3.2 a) To support the scaling up of eHealth services
 - infrastructure for innovative services
- 3.2 b) To support the EU eHealth governance initiative
 - fill the gap between implementation activities and policy actions

3.2 a - To support the scaling up of eHealth services

- **The objective** is to develop a roadmap and create consensus on innovative eHealth services to be deployed on large scale
- Focus on infrastructure for innovative services
- Who:
 - Key stakeholders: experts in deployment, researches, authorities, industries, users.
- What :
 - The work plan should build on current research and focus both on infrastructure aspects as well as specific eHealth systems and solutions to deliver innovation in healthcare.
 - For Public health surveillance (i.e. monitoring pandemic onset); patient safety (i.e. effectiveness of drugs or medical technology)

3.2 b - To support the EU eHealth governance initiative

- **The objective** is facilitating cooperation between Member States in deploying eHealth services
- Who:
 - Member States representatives (High political level/experts level) minimum 18
 - Key stakeholders: healthcare professionals', patients, industry representatives.
- What:
 - High level policy cooperation, as well as strategy and operational implementation
 - identification of priorities where enhanced cooperation is needed; identified areas:
 - legal and organisational aspects, standardisation, semantics and terminology, identification and authentication issues.

3.2 b - To support the EU eHealth governance initiative

- What :
 - Support further cooperation at high level between Member States (State Secretary meetings), implement its outcomes
 - Build on results of existing activities (epSOS, CALLIOPE, Mandate 403 Working Party) for Public health surveillance (i.e. monitoring pandemic onset); patient safety (i.e. effectiveness of drugs or medical technology)
 - Work in close cooperation with the Joint Action on telemedicine and eHealth- Public Health Programme DG SANCO
