This one day event is a unique opportunity to reflect on the new ICT Work Programme for 2009-2010 of the 7th Framework Programme for R&D, as well as to build quality partnerships in the harmonic ambience of Budapest.

ICT Proposers' Day will provide a platform for already existing and future project participants to familiarise themselves with the research challenges and objectives of the new ICT Work Programme. Budapest will also be the right place to bring well-targeted ideas and clearly-defined cooperation needs together from all over Europe and from third countries, in particular from neighbouring regions.

ICT Proposers' Day will be organised as an information fair and therefore no formal agenda is set. The seven challenges of the 2009-2010 ICT Work Programme as well as FET, e-Infrastructure and International Cooperation will be covered, including a series of 'networking booths' for each of the corresponding Work Programme objectives.

European Commission staff will be available to advise on:

- the specifics of the new ICT 2009-2010 Work Programme challenges and objectives,
- the general rules and procedures for participating in calls for proposals.

A key networking activity will be the opportunity for any interested stakeholder (industrial and R&D actors, research institutes, universities, etc.) looking to join a consortium or looking to expand an existing one, to give a short presentation of their activities. As the number of presentations is limited, registration for such presentations is mandatory (see web site).
