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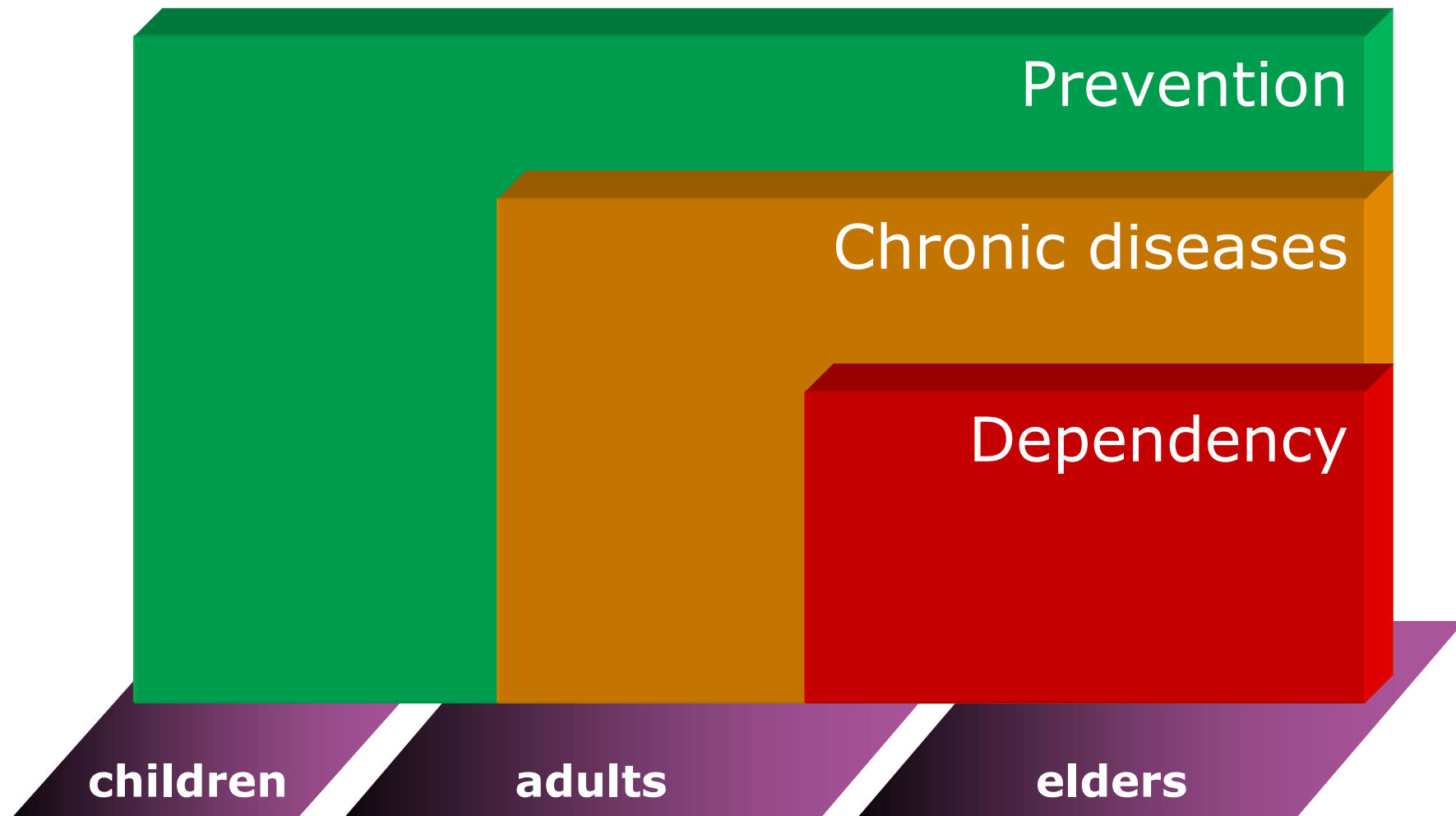
No one left behind

Health status is a major determinant of dependency in elderly



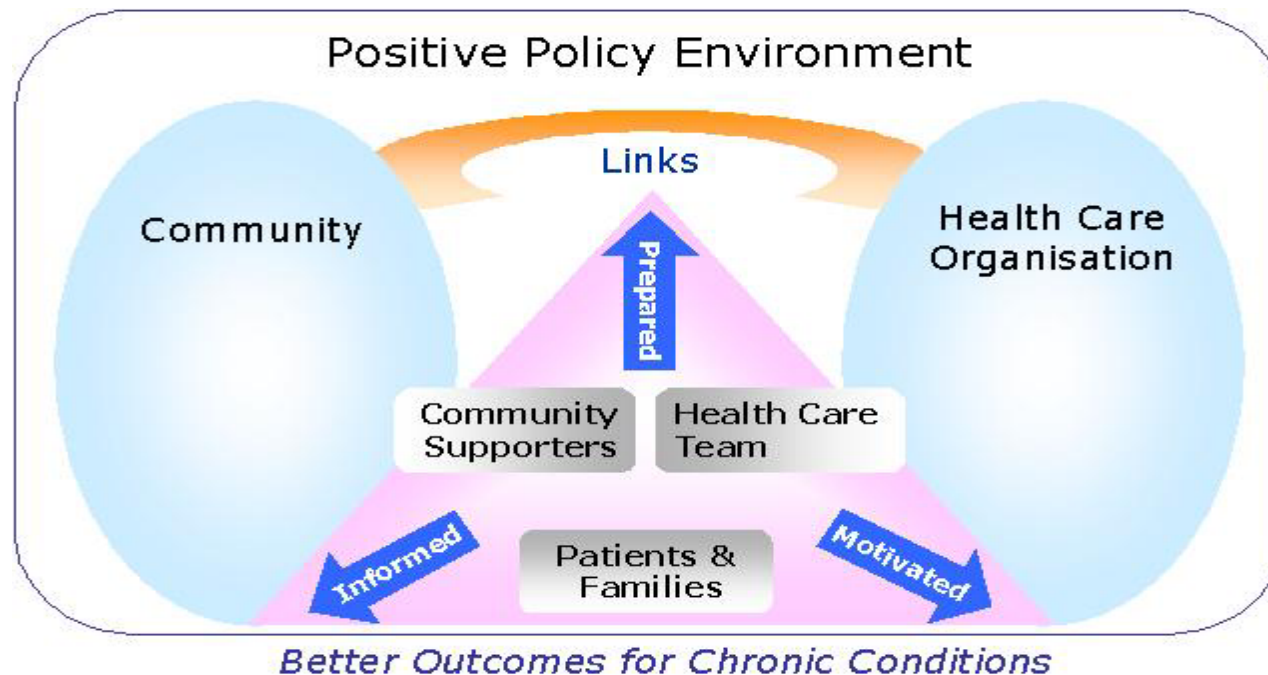


Current fragmentation

(Chronic Care Model, WHO 2002)

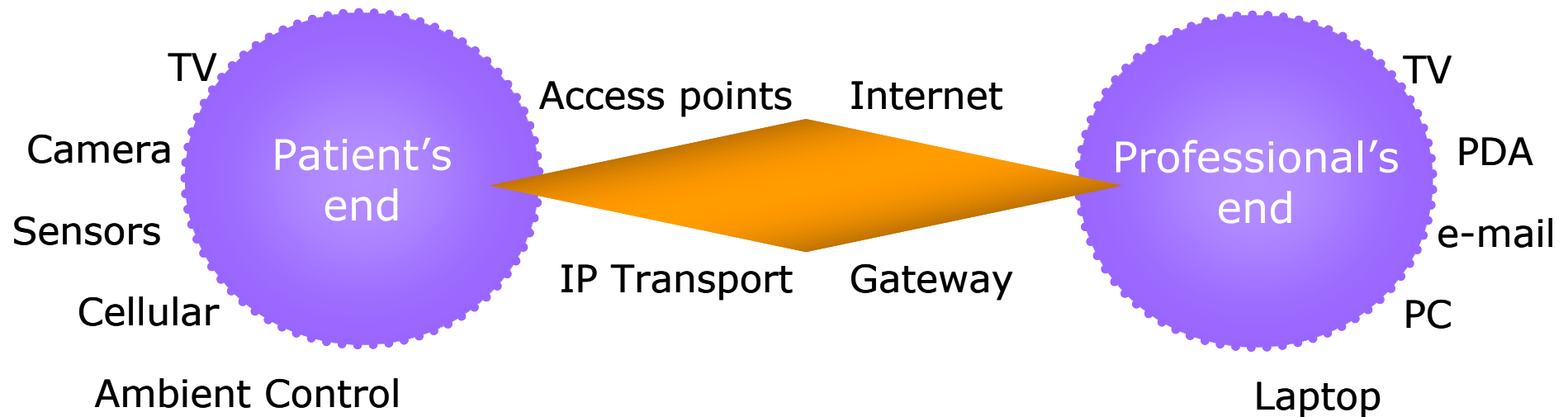


SHINE - *aims*

- Organizational model and validation of associated services
 - Integration between health care and social support
- Technological innovation: development of an IMS-based platform
 - Interactive TV
 - Mobility (videoconference)
- Analysis of legal and ethical issues
