Introduction

Public procurement accounts for 19% of GDP in the EU. It represents therefore an enormous potential market for innovative products and services and offers a powerful leverage for the modernization of public sector and for the competitiveness and growth of the European industry. Public procurement is vital for improving the quality and efficiency of public services at a time of budget constraints.

Yet little public procurement in Europe is aimed at innovation, despite the opportunities under the European legal framework. Compared to other parts of the world, there is a significant underutilization of both Pre-Commercial Procurement (PCP) to get new innovative solutions developed and tested, and Public Procurement of Innovative solutions (PPI), to get new innovative solutions deployed.

This is due to a range of factors, such as: incentives that favour low-risk solutions; lack of knowledge and capabilities regarding the legal and economic basis for innovation procurement; inability to join forces to overcome the fragmentation of public spending; a disconnect between public procurement and other policy objectives and a resistance to modernize the policy instruments to promote innovation.

As ICTs play a major role in the modernization of the public sector, DG CONNECT took several initiatives to do something about this situation. The most recent initiative called European Assistance for Innovation Procurement (www.eafip.eu) aims at promoting and mainstreaming Innovation Procurement across Europe. This is done through the creation of a toolkit that is addressed to policy makers, procurement officers and law firms and the provisioning of on-the-spot assistance tailored to the local legal framework in the preparation and/or implementation of 12 PCP/PPI procurements across the EU.
