

Governance:


To ensure, that the Digital Service Infrastructure fulfills the needs of the many stakeholders, governance is needed to be stable and independent of operators.

We have introduced the concept of an Advisory Committee, on which the current operator has given its view in the circulated "*Official recommendation to the European Commission from the Europeana Foundation Board*".

Through the workshop today, we will discuss Governance at a more rounded level, taking into account the various levels of governance.

Included in this, remember the Advisory Committee, but do not focus on this in particular.

Also remember; we are not discussing, the governance of the Europeana Foundation, but that of the Europeana DSI.



[Context:]

Council conclusion recognised that,

15. the governance of Europeana needs to become more inclusive, involving Member States' governments, the wider network of aggregators and cultural heritage institutions in the setting of strategic priorities and the development of cultural, user-oriented projects on the basis of the available funding; where appropriate, the views of key cultural figures can be taken into account;

Invites the Europeana Operator to:

22. closely involve Member States in the policy- and decision-making. For the Europeana Foundation, this could be organised in particular through participation in the Governing Board of the Member State holding the Presidency of the Council of the EU, the Member State that held the previous Presidency and the Member State that will hold the next Presidency;

An important, action-oriented DSI, like Europeana, needs a balance between efficient decisions, inclusive decisions, and catering to a multiplicity of stakeholders, who's needs are all to be met.




The DSI, and with that, also the governance of the DSI, is owned by the Commission.
