In November 1992, a Council Resolution was adopted calling on Member States to start work within the framework of CEPT on the establishment of an ETNS, and inviting the Commission to facilitate its rapid introduction. Subsequent studies identified that there was potential demand for a numbering space to launch

pan-European services. ETNS was conceived in the 90ies and may be outdated. In order to foster the development of ETNS, the Commission needs to have a clear view on the possible options for the future of ETNS.
