Please allow me to draw your attention to the following.

I heartily support the organisations Bits of Freedom and EDRI with regard to the following and I also think that An open internet is crucial for fundamental freedoms, innovation, and competition. Internet providers already have incentives of their own to stifle the open internet. Governments and private parties, however, are increasingly attempting to force internet providers to stifle the open internet even more for the benefit of narrow sectoral interests. In practice, internet providers already stifle the open internet for the above reasons.

I would like to point out that transparency obligations, competition and minimum guarantees cannot safeguard an open internet. Waiting, however, is not an option, as examples of local loop unbundling and mobile roaming demonstrate.

Narrowly-tailored regulatory EU measures should safeguard the open internet and not limit it even further.

I trust in your goodwill and sense of justice.
