- a.. An open internet is crucial for fundamental freedoms, innovation, and competition.
- a.. Internet providers, however, have incentives of their own to stifle the open internet.
- a.. Furthermore, governments and private parties attempt to force internet providers to stifle the open internet for the benefit of narrow sectoral interests.
- a.. And in practice, internet providers do indeed stifle the open internet for the above reasons.
- a.. Meanwhile, transparency obligations, competition and minimum guarantees cannot safeguard an open internet.
- a.. Waiting is not an option, as the examples of local loop unbundling and mobile roaming demonstrate.
- a.. Narrowly-tailored regulatory EU measures should therefore safeguard the open internet.
