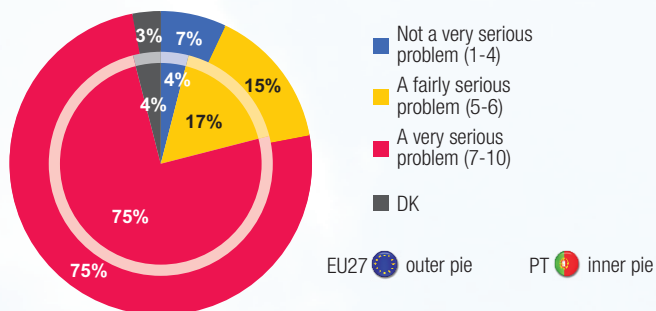


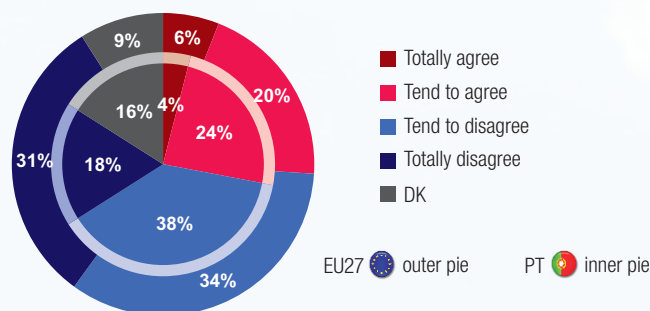
## 1. Extent of the problem

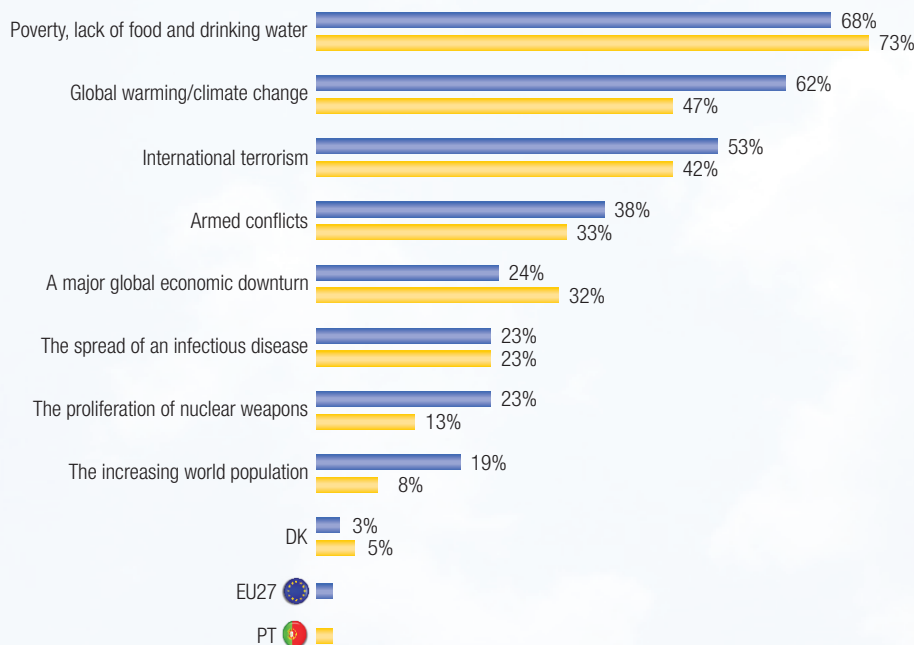
QE5.2 For each of the following statements, please tell me whether you totally agree, tend to agree, tend to disagree or totally disagree...?

Option: First and second answer

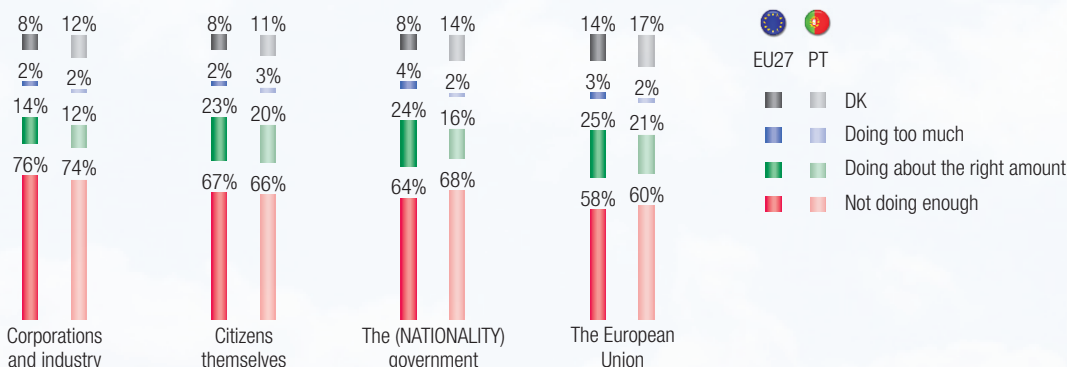

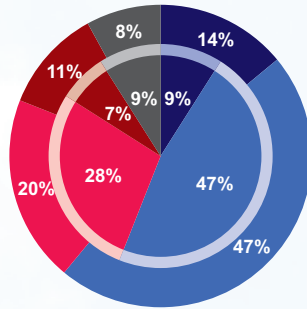
QE4 In your opinion, are each of the following currently doing too much, doing about the right amount, or not doing enough to fight climate change?

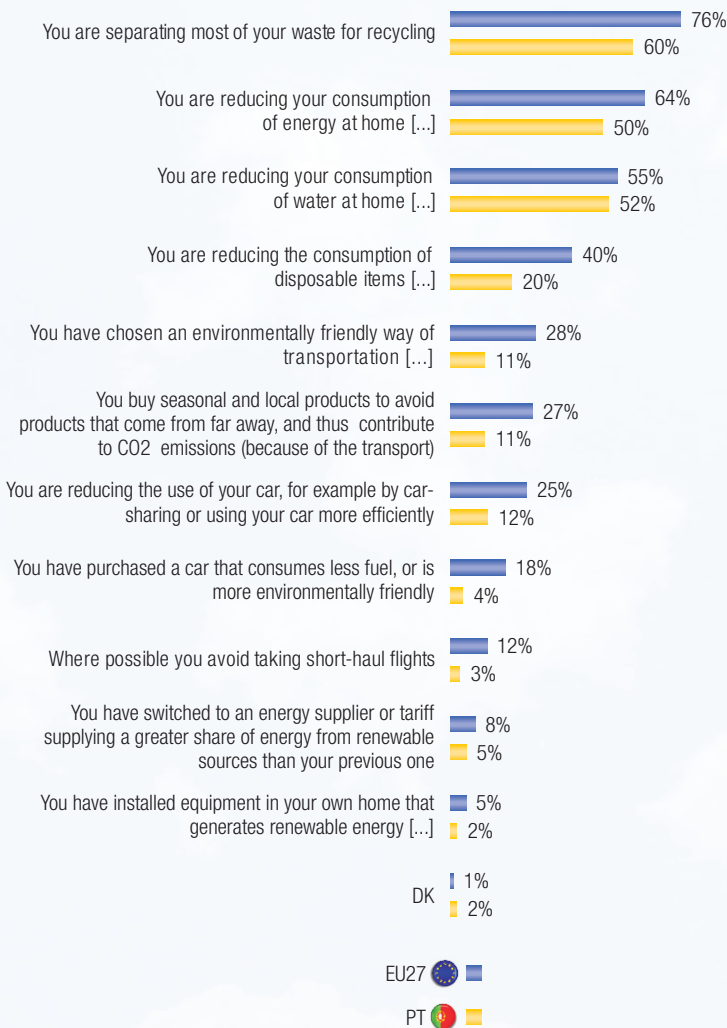
