Stream I: "An accessible Horizon Europe Programme: Proposal submission, evaluation and selection"

As confirmed by the interim evaluation of Horizon 2020, the report by the Lamy Group and other stakeholder feedback, the Horizon 2020 system for evaluating proposals is highly appreciated and one of the reasons of the widely acknowledged successful implementation of Horizon 2020.


The evaluation process in Horizon Europe (HE) will maintain the key principles of the proposal evaluation and selection process of Horizon 2020, with its particular focus on excellence. Proposals should continue to be selected based on the evaluation made by independent experts.

However, the HE proposal adds some novelties (e.g., the missions and the European Innovation Council's requiring a 'portfolio approach) that will require some adaptation of the selection process. In addition, some participants - in particular newcomers and small actors - often perceive the preparation and submission of proposals as burdensome. There has also been criticism by some stakeholders of aspects of the evaluation process itself, in particular regarding feedback to applicants.

As we prepare to update the system for Horizon Europe, stakeholders are requested to express their views on the current arrangements, and how perceived shortcomings can be improved in the future, including any adaptations needed to accommodate novel components of the new programme such as missions and the EIC.
